# Soccer Rules

## I. RULES

- A. Rule Book:**  
F.I.F.A. (latest edition):
- B. Ground Rules:**  
The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school.
- C. Yellow Card:**  
A yellow card is the final warning for a player. Any further infringement by the player will be indicated by a “red card”. Any player who is shown two yellow cards during the tournament will automatically be suspended for the next game. All yellow cards given to a player are wiped after the fourth round matches. EXAMPLE: A player on one yellow card from a previous match is shown a second yellow card in the fourth match of round robin play. He/she is automatically suspended for the next game. In that same match another player is shown his/her first yellow card of the tournament. At the conclusion of the game that yellow card is wiped out and the player starts the next game with no yellow cards.
- D. Red Card:**
1. Any player penalized with a “red card” will be evicted for that game and also miss the next game. No substitutes will be allowed for penalized players. If a player is shown a straight red they will be ineligible for all tournament selection.
  2. If a goalkeeper is shown a red card, a substitute from the bench may come in for the goalkeeper. A field player must then come off, leaving the team to play with 10 players.  
NOTE: The site directors must keep a tally of yellow/red cards received and will inform coaches when a player becomes ineligible.
- E. Teams must play all rounds of the Round Robin even if the last game is a repeat of the Championship Game. Forfeits are not allowed.**

## II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

- A. Playing Time:**  
30 minute halves, 10 minute half times, plus added time for stoppages of play at the referees’ discretion, but without adding extra time for substitutions.
- B. Substitution:** See “Substitution” below

## III. SUBSTITUTION

There will be unlimited substitution subject to the following, which replaces the FIFA substitution rule:

- A.**
1. The team in possession may substitute on throw-ins and goal kicks only. The team not in possession may substitute only if their players have already been “checked in” by officials and only after the team in possession makes a substitution.
  2. Both teams may substitute after a goal has been scored.
  3. If the referee invites, or asks that, a player be removed from the field due to injury, both teams are allowed to make a substitution at that time.
- B.** A designated person, other than the Site Director, will coordinate and monitor the substitutions to ensure that all substitutions are made in the approved manner.
- C.** Coaches may use their entire bench in every match.
- D.** The fourth official monitoring substitutions must use a loud noisemaking device, other than a whistle, to attract the attention of the referee for substitutions.

## IV. FACILITIES

Two soccer pitches are required, one of which must be on the high school campus with some spectator seating. The other pitch should either be on campus or be very near the high school.

## V. UNIFORMS

- A.** Each player must wear protective shin guards.
- B.** Each player must have both a light and dark colored jersey with numbers on both the front and back. FIFA has no firm regulations on number size or location. Most leagues insist on numbers on back of jersey only, 6 inches (15cm) in height.
- C.** Home teams will wear light colored jerseys and light colored socks, while visiting teams will wear dark colored jerseys and dark colored socks.

**VI. OFFICIALS**

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate tournaments.

**VII. TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS**

**A. Head to Head**

Definition of Head to Head as specified in section M of the convention organization. If two teams are tied, go to C. If more than two teams are tied, go to B.

**B. Goal Difference**

Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in matches exclusively involving the tied teams. The team with the highest score is the winner. If tied, go to C.

**C. Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in matches exclusively involving the tied teams and the highest placed team in the league standings not involved in the tie. If teams are tied for positions 3 - 5 take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in matches involving the tied teams and the higher placed teams in the league standings not involved in the tie.**

**D. Shoot-out:** See section IX.

**VIII. TIE BREAKER FOR CHAMPIONSHIP & CONSOLATION GAMES-OVERTIME**

**A.** Following a five-minute break after regulation play, the respective captains will report to mid-field where the referee will perform the coin toss.

**B.** An 11-a-side overtime will be played. The first team to score is declared the winner. If no team has scored after 7 minutes the teams will exchange field positions. If no team has scored after a further 7 minutes, teams will go to the shoot-out procedure.

**IX. TIE BREAKER FOR CHAMPIONSHIP & CONSOLATION GAMES-SHOOT-OUT**

**A.** Each team will be represented by five shooters from the 11 players on the field at the end of overtime.

**B.** All shooters will report to the referee

**C.** The referee will record the shooting order

**D.** The winner of the shoot-out is based on the most goals scored by either team in five attempts

**E.** If a tie exists at this point, the shoot-out will continue until a winner is determined.

**X. EMERGENCY PROTOCOL**

In the event of an emergency situation putting a convention/tournament in jeopardy, the Convention Director should collect all of the information he/she needs and then call a meeting of the ADs/Administrators present (including Administrators-In-Charge). This meeting is for input and advice only. While coaches should not attend this meeting, time should be given to allow the administrators to communicate with their coaches.

The Convention Director should endeavor to complete as much of the event as possible. In the case of an athletic event, priority should be given to completing the round robin portion of the tournament, as an incomplete round robin would leave the tournament without a result. If the round robin has been completed, priority should be given to playing the championship matches as time permits.

At the conclusion of this process, the Convention Director will make a final decision and announce such to all of the participants attending the convention.

**XI. TOURNAMENT SCORING**

**A.** 3 points for a win

**B.** 1 point for a draw

**C.** 0 points for a loss

**XII. POST SECTION PLAY**

• After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

• The 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> ranked teams will play for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

• There will be no post section play for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> ranked teams.
