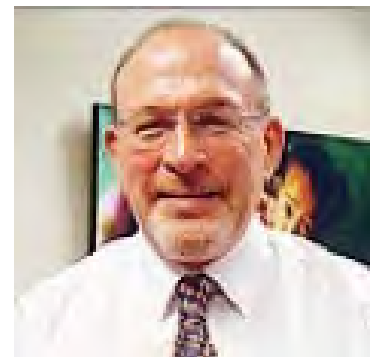

Laundry

Each team will drop off their uniforms in their designated box in the rest area at the end of the day on Thursday and Friday. They can be picked up in the student rest area the next morning. No laundry service will be available on Saturday. NOTE: Uniforms only, please. Non-uniform items in the laundry basket will be placed in a Lost & Found box.

Curfew

9:00 pm on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights and approximately 10:00 pm on Saturday night. If the tournament runs late curfew will be extended one hour after the end of the last activity of the evening.

IASAS Tennis Rules

Rule Book:

ITF Rules of Tennis (latest edition)

A. Match Schedules

Please see the schedule that is generated using the Tennis tab in the IASAS Schedule Maker Pro 2.7. This schedule is a sample schedule for an 8-court facility. The schedule for a different size facility will have to be modified by the AD of the host school. The Schedule Maker document is located in the Forms section of the IASAS Handbook under Organizational Forms.

B. Meet Rules:

1. Each school fields one boys' team and one girls' team.
2. On each team 3 members will play singles and 4 will play doubles.
3. Players must be ranked according to ability for singles and doubles #1, #2 & #3. Number #1 ranking being the top player.
4. The #1 ranked players from each school will play each other, the #2 ranked players will play each other, and the #3 ranked players will play each other, in the round robin. Once a player or doubles team has been assigned a ranking, he/she cannot change ranking during the tournament.
5. Each team match will consist of 3 singles and 2 doubles, with the winning team decided by the best of 5 matches. All matches must be played.
6.
 - a. The 8th player substitute will play in Alternate (exhibition) matches. The 8th player may substitute into the tournament at any position if a player is unable to participate. No player can substitute during a match. No players can switch ranking once the tournament has started.
 - b. The tournament director should have the flexibility to schedule the 8th player matches to best suit the schedule and the needs of the tournament and should attempt to give the 8th player at least 3 matches.
 - c. The 8th player will be eligible to play at any position as a "free switch" during the tournament. At such a switch the original player may only return to their original position. This free switch may occur as many as 3 times during the tournament. The alternate may switch/substitute with any position player before the start of any match. Example: 1st doubles Player A has a stomach ache, the coach sits him/her and sends the alternate to play in his/her place. Player A recovers the next morning and is ready to play, so the coach reinserts Player A into first doubles. This is considered a second free switch, thus the alternate player can switch one more time. This switch would be the third one and the alternate player would then have to complete the tournament in that position.
7. The tournament will be run on a round-robin format with subsequent consolation and championship matches. The team rankings will be determined by win-loss records at the conclusion of round robin play. In case of tie following round-robin play, rules under **VII. SCORING** will apply. As stated in the Organization section of this Handbook, if a championship or consolation match cannot be played, then final placing will be determined by the round robin standings.
8. There will be a 5-minute warm-up before each match. There will be no rest period after the 1st game of a set (but still change sides). The first rest period is after the 3rd game and then after each further two games until the conclusion of the set.
9. Players will call their own lines and keep score. A player can request an official to assist with calling the lines if he/she believes that there is a need. Players make that request to their coach who will then confer with the Site Director. The official charged with overseeing the match will overturn or confirm a call if disputed/challenged by the opponent and if the official clearly saw the disputed ball.

A coach should advise other coaches and Site-Directors if a student on his or her team needs assistance with the rules. This notification should be made at the pre-tournament meeting or whenever the need arises. This player would then automatically be assisted by a tournament official throughout the tournament.

10. Players must report to the main desk before and immediately after the match to report the score.
11. A player reporting more than fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled match time will be declared a forfeit.
12. Side changes will be a maximum of 60 seconds in duration. Coaches will be allowed to consult with their players during the side-change. Coaches will not be allowed on the courts for consultation unless there is no outside access.
13. Order of play will be as follows:
 - #2 Doubles
 - #3 Singles
 - #2 Singles
 - #1 Doubles
 - #1 Singles
14. In the event of an injury during a match, a 5-minute injury time for treatment be allowed to determine if the player can continue. The Site Director should monitor the situation.

II. ROSTERS

Rosters (eight boys and eight girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- Name
- Grade
- Passport nationality
- Birth date
- Housing preferences
- Playing position

Coaches will declare final seeds on Monday of tournament week by 3pm so that the seeds (positions) can be put into the tournament program/webpage. Coaches cannot change seeds after this time and substitutions can only be made due to injure/visa/emergency issues. Any changes must be advised to the host AD or tournament director upon arrival. Changes at the pre-tournament meeting are not allowed.

III. FACILITIES/EQUIPMENT

A minimum of 8 tennis courts are required. A minimum of three new balls per match are required.

IV. UNIFORMS

Each member of the team will wear the same uniform. Shorts or skirts must be of the same color. Appropriate tennis attire must be worn. No spaghetti straps or bare midriffs for girls and no sleeveless shirts for boys. Players must start the match in the school uniform (same uniform if doubles), but they may change shirts later in the match into other clothing designated as the team uniform.

V. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate the tournament.

VI. PROTESTS

All protests are to go through the Tournament Director or the Convention Director.

VII. SCORING

All boys' and girls' events will be scored separately. Matches will consist of one 8-game "Pro-Set". The first player to win 8 games will win the match. Should the game score in the "Pro-Set" be tied at 7-7, then a regular tie-breaker will be played to determine the match winner.

If there are significant delays due to weather or other conditions at any time during the tournament, the Tournament Director may make the decision to change individual match scoring to a first to 6-game set.

VIII. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide 1st and 2nd place.

The 3rd and 4th ranked teams will play for 3rd place.

There will be no post section play for the 5th and 6th ranked teams.

IX. TIE-BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

Should the competition end in a tie, the following criteria will be used to determine the winner:

A. Head to Head

B. (Definition of Head to Head can be found in Section L of Convention Organization.)

If after L.3 teams are still tied, go to B.

C. Match difference (for three or more tied teams):

1. Add the total matches won and the total matches lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
2. Get the match difference of all the matches played of the teams involved in the tie. If still tied go to

D. Game Difference:

Add the total games won and the total games lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored.

X. AWARDS

A. Championship Team:

- 1 IASAS Traveling Plaque
- 2 IASAS Championship Plaque
- 3 Team Members-Champion Chevrons (10)
- 4 Team Members – Gold Medals (10)

B. Runner-up:

- 1 Team Members-Runner-up Chevrons (10)
- 2 Team Members – Silver Medals (10)

C. Third Place: Team Members – Bronze Medals (10)

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

PARTICIPANTS

1. Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations and violations of the “off-limits” areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event. (4/01)

When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / “off limits” areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- i The student may no longer participate in that convention.
 - ii The student will be sent home at his/her parents’ expense if it is feasible to do so.
 - iii Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - Appropriate counseling will be required.
 - The student will be required to spend all free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
 - The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, ie. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
 - The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
 - Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.
 - Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
 - Other Individual School’s Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
 - iv. For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.
 - v. If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.
 - vi Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
2. Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
 3. Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
 4. All visiting students must return to the host families’ house before curfew-as set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
 5. All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
 6. No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip Administrator.
 7. The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
 8. Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
 9. Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.
 10. All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them.



Medical Procedures



1. In case of injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competitions, the site director, tournament director, or school nurse should be notified. The medical staff will be located in the Breezeway across from Rajendra while the medical staff for Sports Complex will be located on-site. The nurses and medical personnel will be present and on-site for the duration of the tournament.
2. An injured athlete should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site or tournament director and the ISB nurse on duty.
3. The school nurses are permitted to issue students only non-prescription medication.
4. In case of an injury or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call ISB (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either host families or one of the tournament officials at their home as listed in this program.
5. In case of an emergency, there will be an ambulance available at the campus on all three days of the competition.

ISB/IASAS HOSTING POLICY

Child Protection:

ISB endeavors to ensure that students in our care are protected from all forms of abuse. Hosting exchanges (arts and athletics) form an invaluable part of ISB's co-curricular program. Safeguarding the well-being of students entrusted to ISB requires the following standards to be met:

1. **In Loco Parentis** (Latin: In place of a parent) While hosting visiting students, parents assume the responsibility of the acting parent to provide safe and secure environments.
2. **Safety and Welfare** Families protect visiting students from any form of abuse, violence, or undue trauma. Parents must provide adequate care and ensure the welfare of those entrusted to their custody. (outlined in the ISB Hosting Expectations Letter).
3. **Rules and Conduct** Host families must acknowledge they have read and understand the IASAS (Interscholastic Association of Southeast Asian Schools) Rules and Guidelines and help to ensure that visiting students adhere to these expectations. Students not in compliance may be sanctioned. Host families who do not follow the rules and guidelines put themselves and the safety of the visiting students at risk.
4. **Accommodation** No visiting students shall be hosted alone. Therefore, all hosting agreements are for a minimum of two students. Accommodation may be basic, with students sharing a room. Cases where more than four students are assigned to the same host or where mixed genders are assigned to the same location require review by the host and visiting Activities/Athletic Director(s).
