Laundry

Each team will drop off their uniforms in their designated box in the rest area at the end of the day on Thursday and Friday. They can be picked up in the student rest area the next morning. No laundry service will be available on Saturday. NOTE: Uniforms only, please. Non-uniform items in the laundry basket will be placed in a Lost & Found box.

Curfew

9:00 pm on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights and approximately 10:00 pm on Saturday night. If the tournament runs late curfew will be extended one hour after the end of the last activity of the evening.

Food

The main cafeteria will be open from 6:00 am until 1:00 pm with Thai and Western food available. After 1:00 pm only The Grind will be open until 5pm. Alice's Pizza Truck, Cafe Kabul, Subway, Baan Kimchi, Cherry Cafe, Emack & Bolio, Vista Cafe, and the ISB Booster Club will be on sale during the event outside Rajendra Hall.

There is a tournament buffet on Saturday night for all IASAS athletes and coaches, provided by Epicure and served in the cafeteria. This buffet will be ongoing from 4:30-6:30pm

Gate Passes

Participants will receive a tournament ID/gate pass upon arrival at ISB. These passes must be presented to ISB security personnel when entering or leaving campus. Please note that these gate passes will be collected on Sunday morning.

Coaches' Hospitality Room

The Health Room on the second floor, above Rajendra, will be open for coaches, administrators, and site directors. It will be stocked daily with coffee, tea, drinks, snacks and fruit courtesy of the ISB Booster Club & ISB Athletics. Epicure will also provide a hot lunch for coaches, administrators and officials each day.

Athletes' Rest Area

The field-side half of Rajendra will be used as the athletes' rest area. It will only be accessed via the fields, not the Breezeway. Please keep this areas neat, clean, and QUIET. Please bring only water into the gym, no food or other drinks. We will be streaming IASAS S3 events inside. Thank you in advance for keeping this area clean and restful!!

Locker Rooms

The locker rooms and showers are located next to Rajendra Hall and adjacent to the Sports Complex. You must provide your own towel, soap and shampoo for showers. Please DO NOT leave any bags or valuables in the locker room.

Warm-Up Area

The warm-up area will be on Field A. The field will be divided into quarters, so each of the four teams scheduled to play in the next game can use a space. The batting cages on Reinsch will also be available to the baseball teams, with each team allowed use of one cage. There is one softball cage that must be shared between the two teams warming up. Each team will get 5-minute infield before the game begins, and games will start on time or 15 minutes after the previous game ends. Please be ready to take the field.

Athletic Trainer / Nurses / Emergency Service

The ISB Athletic Trainer will be on-site to deal with any injuries that occur during the tournament. Teams must bring their own tape and are responsible for their own preventative taping. The AT will assist with any injuries that are incurred during the tournament. There will be ISB nurses stationed in the Breezeway and a medical team under the big tree outside of Reinsch Field. There will also be an emergency medical team and ambulance for the duration of the tournament.

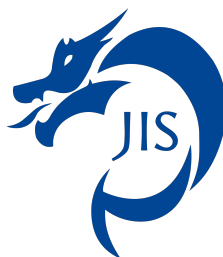

IASAS BASEBALL RULES

A. Rule Book:

NFHS Official Rules of Baseball (National Federation of State High School Athletics)

B. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school. Games will be scheduled at 2-hour increments with the understanding that game times are approximate. In fact, subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game.

C. General Rules:

1. All tournament games will be 6 innings.
2. In all games except the championship game a mercy rule will be in effect as follows: 15 runs after three innings; 10 runs after four innings.
3. In all games except the championship game teams will change from fielding to batting when the batting team has scored 8 runs in an inning regardless of how many outs there are. This rule applies only to innings 1 and 2 of a game.
4. All tournament games except for the championship game will have a no-new inning time limit of 1 hour and 40 minutes. Official games, however, must be at least 4 innings (3 ½ if the home team is winning) except in the case of inclement weather.
5. Designated Hitters are allowed as governed by NFHS rules (Rule 3, Section 1, Article 4).

D. Pitching:

IASAS Baseball will operate under a pitching policy with regards to the total number of pitches thrown in a game, in a day, or over multiple days. This policy addresses the total pitches thrown and the required days of rest.

1. TOTAL PITCHES THROWN IN A GAME OR IN A DAY: 120
2. TOTAL PITCHES THROWN IN A TOURNAMENT: 150

3. REQUIRED REST PERIOD:

0 – 50 Pitches	0 Days
51 – 80 Pitches	1 Day
81 – 120 Pitches	2 Days

4. NOTES:

A pitcher shall not throw more than 120 pitches in a single game or in a single day.

A pitcher shall not throw more than two consecutive days unless the pitch count is below 50 pitches per day. Pitchers may pitch in multiple games per day but the pitch count will be the total for the two games and the requisite days of rest as stated above shall be adhered to. Rest days are “calendar” days. When reaching a maximum pitch count for either a day (120) or tournament (150), the pitcher may finish pitching to that batter but must be replaced immediately when the at bat ends.

5. TABULATION OF PITCH COUNTS:

The pitch count tabulation will be conducted by a person designated by the tournament director. Pitch count information will be made available to each school following the completion of each game.

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

A. Speed Up Rules:

3. Warm-up pitches: seven (7) when entering the game, four (4) each inning after.
4. Batters may only take one foot out of batter’s box to take signals from coach.
5. After infield put-out with no runners on base the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.

6. After an outfield put-out with no runners on base, the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.

For all games except the Championship and Consolation Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and two umpires. For the Consolation and Championship Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and at least three umpires.

VIII. TIEBREAKER

A. In Round Robin Play and Post Section play.

- 1 If after six innings, or after 1 hour 40 minutes of play in non-championship games, the game is tied, one extra inning will be played with a base runner starting on 2nd base.

- 2 If after one extra inning, the game is still tied, a second inning will be played with base runners on 2nd and 3rd base.
- 3 The above (#2) will continue until there is a winner.
- 4 The number of pitches will count towards the pitcher's total pitch count.

B. Final Team Ranking

The Round Robin Record (Win/Loss) shall determine final standings.

1. Three Tied Teams (if at any point in below process the tie is broken and the top team is determined, the Head-to-Head result will be the remaining tiebreaker).
2. If three teams are tied in terms of overall record the following shall be applied:
 - a. Head-to-Head results. The outcome of the individual Head-to-Head games may result in a broken tie.
 - b. If still tied: the least number of runs given up in games among the tied teams.
 - c. If still tied, the total number of runners to reach 3rd base in any way in games among the tied teams.
 - d. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 2nd base in any way in games among the tied teams.
 - e. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 1st base in any way in games among the tied teams.

IX. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide first and second place.

The third and fourth ranked teams will play for third place.

There will be no post section play for the fifth and sixth ranked teams.

It is recommended that Championship Games should not be played concurrently.

IASAS SOFTBALL RULES

Rule Book:

NFHS Official Rules of Softball (National Federation of State High School Athletics)

A. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school. Games will be scheduled at 2-hour increments with the understanding that game times are approximate. Subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game.

B. General Rules:

1. All tournament games will be 6 innings.
2. In all games except for the championship game a mercy rule will be in effect as follows: 15 runs after 3 innings; 10 runs after four innings.
3. In all games except for the championship game teams will change from fielding to batting when the batting team has scored 8 runs in an inning regardless of how many outs there are. This rule applies only to innings 1 and 2 of a game.
4. All tournament games except for the championship game will have a no-new inning time limit of 1 hour and 40 minutes. Official games, however, must be at least 4 innings (3 ½ if the home team is winning) except in the case of inclement weather.
5. A team may use the Designated Player/Flex option as governed by NFHS rules (Rule 3, Section 3, Article 6).

C. Pitching:

1. No Pitcher may pitch more than 25 innings during the entire tournament. Any appearance in an inning counts as a full inning pitched. (Appearances in extra innings of a game will NOT count towards the total innings pitched.)
 - a. Teams will count innings for their own pitchers and confirm with the official scorer after each game.

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

A. Speed Up Rules:

1. Courtesy runner is mandatory for the pitcher and/or catcher when there are two (2) outs in an inning.
2. On-deck batters retrieve all foul balls and passed balls with no runners on base; give to the umpire when they come to bat.
3. Warm-up pitches: seven (7) when entering the game, four (4) each inning after.
4. Batters may take one foot out of batter's box to take signals from coach.
5. After infield put-out with no runners on base the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.
6. After outfield put-out with no runners on base, the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.

For all games except the Championship and Consolation Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and two umpires. For the Consolation and Championship Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and at least three umpires.

VIII. TIEBREAKER

A. In Round Robin Play and Post Section play.

- 1 If after six innings, or after 1 hour 40 minutes of play in non-championship games, the game is tied, one extra inning will be played with a base runner starting on 2nd base.
- 2 If after one extra inning, the game is still tied, a second inning will be played with base runners on 2nd and 3rd base.
- 3 The above (#2) will continue until there is a winner.

B. Final Team Ranking

The Round Robin Record (Win/Loss) shall determine final standings.

1. Three Tied Teams (if at any point in below process the tie is broken and the top team is determined, the Head-to-Head result will be the remaining tiebreaker).
2. If three teams are tied in terms of overall record the following shall be applied:
 - a. Head-to-Head results. The outcome of the individual Head-to-Head games may result in a broken tie.
 - b. If still tied: the least number of runs given up in games among the tied teams.
 - c. If still tied, the total number of runners to reach 3rd base in any way in games among the tied teams.
 - d. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 2nd base in any way in games among the tied teams.

- e. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 1st base in any way in games among the tied teams.

IX. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide first and second place.

The third and fourth ranked teams will play for third place.

There will be no post section play for the fifth and sixth ranked teams.

It is recommended that Championship Games should not be played concurrently. If a Championship game is scheduled at a given time, but a previous game runs over time, the start of the next Championship Game will be delayed. Do note that the Tournament Director has the right to moderate the schedule if weather or the time of day become a concern.

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

PARTICIPANTS

1. Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations and violations of the “off-limits” areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event. (4/01)

When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / “off limits” areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- i The student may no longer participate in that convention.
 - ii The student will be sent home at his/her parents’ expense if it is feasible to do so.
 - iii Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - Appropriate counseling will be required.
 - The student will be required to spend all free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
 - The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, ie. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
 - The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
 - Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.
 - Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
 - Other Individual School’s Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
 - iv For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.
 - v If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.
 - vi Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
2. Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
 3. Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
 4. All visiting students must return to the host families’ house before curfew-as set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
 5. All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
 6. No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip Administrator.
 7. The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
 8. Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
 9. Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.
 10. All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them.
