I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

Each participant and his/her parent must sign and return this form before traveling or hosting, by so doing they acknowledge that they fully understand and agree to abide by these RULES & GUIDELINES.

Participants

- 1. Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations and violations of the "off-limits" areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event. (4/01)
 When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / "off limits" areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:
 - i. The student may no longer participate in that convention.
 - ii. The student will be sent home at his/her parents' expense if it is feasible to do so
 - iii. Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - · Appropriate counseling will be required.

- The student will be required to spend all free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
- The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, ie. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
- The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
- Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.



- Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
- Other Individual School's Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
- iv. For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.
- v. If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.
- vi. Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
- 2. Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/ convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian
- 3. Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
- 4. All visiting students must return to the host families' house before curfewas set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
- 5. All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
- No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director
 without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip
 Administrator.
- 7. The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
- 8. Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
- 9. Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.

10. All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them

Host Families

- 1. All host families will be provided with complete Tournament/Convention details (schedules, curfews, policies, procedures, emergency phone numbers for coaches and important tournament personnel, etc.).
- 2. Host parents/guardians will not offer housing unless one of the parents/guardians is present for the duration of the tournament/convention.
- 3. Hosts are expected to cooperate with Tournament/Convention Director in ensuring student compliance with all IASAS policies relating to participation.
- 4. Any student who shows reluctance to fully comply with the above rules and regulations shall be reported to the Tournament/Convention Director who will report the matter to the student's coach and Administrator in charge with the expectation that action will be taken.

Ceremonies



Competition Rules:

- The IASAS Baseball & Softball Championships 2018 will be governed by the rules of the game as stated in the latest editions of the NFHS rules books.
- The IASAS handbook for Baseball & Softball will also be used for rule rule exceptions and IASAS specific details.

Game Officials: Umpires for the baseball and softball games will be supplied by from the DKI Jakarta Baseball Umpire Association.

Dugouts: The dugouts on the 1st base side of the fields will be designated for the "Home" teams. The dugouts on the 3rd base side of the fields will be designated for the "Visiting" teams.

Warm-up Areas: Field 1 on the JIS campus is the location for team warm-up areas. No other areas will be allowed during the duration of the event. Field 1 will be split into four sections for the four teams warming up prior to each game. This field is located 400m from the baseball and softball stadiums. It is the responsibility of individual teams to arrive to their games on time. The game schedule is an approximation of game start times. In fact, subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game. If a team arrives late they forfeit their right to an on-field warm-up period.

On-field warm-up period prior to games:

Subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game. As soon as dugouts from the previous game are cleared on-field warm-ups will start 2-minutes after this moment. Each team is allowed a 5-minute on-field warm-up period prior to each game. The Visiting team will warm-up on the field first. The Home team will warm-up last on the field and remain in their positions after the warm-up has finished. If a team arrives late to the field they forfeit their right to an on-field warm-up period.

I.A.S.A.S HANDBOOK: BASEBALL

I. RULES

A. Rule Book

NFHS Official Rules of Baseball (National Federation of State High School Athletics)

B. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school. Games will be scheduled at 2-hour increments with the understanding that game times are approximate. In fact, subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game.

C. General Rules:

- 1. All tournament games (except the Championship Game) will be 5 innings. The Championship Game will be 7 innings.
- 2. In all games except the Championship game, a 10-run mercy rule will operate after four (4) innings.
- 3. In all games except the Championship game, teams will change from fielding to batting when the batting team has scored 8 runs in an inning (regardless of how many outs there are). This rule applies only to innings 1, 2 and 3 of a game. (04/17)
- 4. All tournament games (except the Championship game) will have a no-new inning time limit of 1 hour and 45 minutes.

D. Pitching:

IASAS Baseball will operate under a pitching policy with regards to the total number of pitches thrown in a game, in a day, or over multiple days. This policy addresses the total pitches thrown and the required days of rest.

- 1. TOTAL PITCHES THROWN IN A GAME OR IN A DAY: 120
- 2. TOTAL PITCHES THROWN IN A TOURNAMENT: 150
- 3. REQUIRED REST PERIOD:
 - · 0 50 pitches = 0 rest days required
 - · 51.-80 pitches = 1 rest day required
 - · 81 120 pitchers = 2 rest days required



4 NOTES:

- · A pitcher shall not throw more than 120 pitches in a single game or in a single day.
- · A pitcher shall not throw more than two consecutive days unless the pitch count is below 50 pitches per day.
- Pitchers may pitch in multiple games per day but the pitch count will be the total for the two games and the requisite days of rest as stated above shall be adhered to.
- · Rest days are "calendar" days.
- When reaching a maximum pitch count for either a day (120) or tournament (150), the pitcher may finish pitching to that batter but must be replaced immediately when the at bat ends.

5. TABULATION OF PITCH COUNTS:

 The pitch count tabulation will be conducted by a person designated by the tournament director. Pitch count information will be made available to each school following the completion of each game.

II. RULES EXCEPTIONS

A. Speed Up Rules:

- 1. Courtesy runner is permitted for the pitcher and/or catcher when there are two (2) outs in an inning.
- 2. On-deck batters retrieve all foul balls and passed balls with no runners on base; give to the umpire when they come to bat.
- 3. Warm-up pitches: seven (7) when entering the game, four (4) each inning after.
- 4. Batters may only take one foot out of batter's box to take signals from coach.
- 5. After infield put-out with no runners on base the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.
- 6. After an outfield put-out with no runners on base the ball must be directly returned to pitcher.

Rosters (12 girls) must be submitted two week prior to the tournament and include the following information:

V. FACILITIES

One 60-foot softball diamond is required for the Softball Tournament. The outfield fence dimensions must be shared with all arriving teams with the first communication.

VI. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

VII. OFFICIALS

For all games except the Championship and Consolation Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and two umpires. For the Consolation and Championship Games, there will be one official scorekeeper and three umpires.

VIII. TIEBREAKER

A.In Round Robin Flay and Post Section playo

- 1. If after seven (7) innings or after 1 hour 45 minutes of play, the game is tied, one extra inning will be played with a base runner starting on 2nd base.
- 2. If after one extra inning, the game is still tied, a second inning will be played



with base runners on 2nd and 3rd base.

3. The above (#2) will continue until there is a winner.

B.Final Team Ranking

The Round Robin Record (Win/Loss) shall determine final standings.

- 1. Three Tied Teams (if at any point in below process the tie is broken and the top team is determined, the Head-to-Head result will be the remaining tiebreaker).
- 2. If three teams are tied in terms of overall record the following shall be applied:
 - a. Head-to-Head results. The outcome of the individual Head-to-Head games may result in a broken tie.
 - b. If still tied: the least number of runs given up in games among the tied teams. (04/17)
 - c. If still tied, the total number of runners to reach 3rd base in any way in games among the tied teams.
 - d. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 2nd base in any way in games among the tied teams.
 - e. If still tied: the total number of runners to reach 1st base in any way in games among the tied teams.

IX. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship game to decide first and second place.

The third and fourth ranked teams will play for third place.

There will be no post section play for the fifth and sixth ranked teams.

It is recommended that the boys and girls championship games should not be played concurrently. If a championship game is scheduled at a given time but a previous game runs over time, the start of the next championship game will be delayed. Do note that the Tournament Director has the right to moderate the schedule if weather of the time of day becomes a concern.
