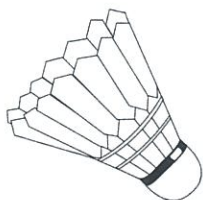

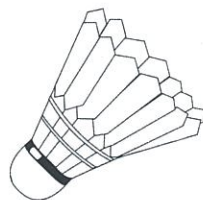

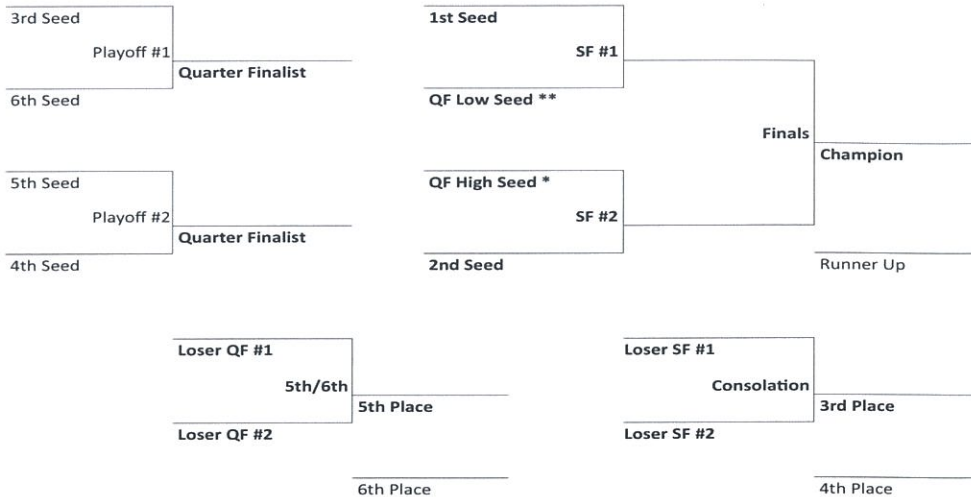

BADMINTON RULES

I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

BWF (latest edition)

B. Meet Rules:

1. Each team match will consist of 3 singles and 2 doubles, with the winning team decided by the best of 5 matches. All matches must be played.
2. Players must be ranked according to ability for singles and doubles #1, #2, and #3. Number #1 ranking being the top player. Line-ups will be given to the Site Director at the start of each match and cannot be changed during the match.
3. The #1 ranked players from each school will play each other, the #2 ranked players will play each other and the #3 ranked players will play each other in the round robin. Once a player or doubles team has been assigned a ranking, he/she cannot change the ranking during the tournament.
4. The 8th player substitute will play exhibition matches. The 8th player may substitute into the tournament at any position if a player is unable to participate. No player can substitute during a match. No players can switch ranking once the tournament has started. To qualify for all-tournament a player must participate in all five matches. The 8th player (alternate) with the best won-loss record should achieve All-Tournament recognition and a chevron. The 8th player will be eligible to play at either #3 singles or the #2 doubles position, as a "free switch" during the tournament. At such a switch, the original #3 singles or #2 doubles person would play in the Alternate match and the #8 player will play in the new position. Only the originally designated 8th player is eligible to play in any of the 3 mentioned positions. If the original 8th person is used because of an injury, at any position, the "free switch" is no longer possible, since they must play in that position for the remainder of the tournament. No All-Tournament Award can be awarded to a position that has been substituted in singles or doubles as a free switch.
5. The tournament will be run on a round-robin format. In the round robin matches, the first two games will be played first to 21 points (capped, no need to win by two points). The third game will also be capped to 21 points but must be won by two points with a cap of 30. The round-robin league standing of the teams will be determined by their win-loss record with all teams advancing to a post section play, see VIII. POST SECTION PLAY. In case of a tie following the round-robin play, rules under IX. THE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDING will apply. The post section matches will be played as usual to 21 points (win by two points, cap of 30).
6. There will be a ten-minute warm-up before each match.
7. Players will call their own lines and keep score.
8. Players must report to the main desk before the start of their match.
9. A player reporting more than fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled match will be declared a walk over.
10. Coaches will be allowed to consult with their players for 60 seconds during each game when the leading scorer reaches 11 points and between sets. Coaches will not be allowed on the courts for consultation unless there is no outside access.
11. Order of play will be as follows:
 - a. #3 Singles
 - b. #2 Doubles
 - c. Alternates
 - d. #2 Singles
 - e. #1 Doubles
 - f. #1 SinglesPlease note that whenever possible matches a, b and c should be played concurrently on three courts followed by matches d, e and f.

12. In the event of an injury during a match, only one 5-minute injury time for treatment will be allowed for the duration of that match to determine if the player can continue. The Site Director should monitor the situation.

13. The right to towel-off and/or drink during a match can only be initiated by the serving team.

14. When illegal serves are not contested by the opposing player, the coach of the opposing player is allowed to summon the official to the court for review. The official will inform the player of serving error(s) for player correction. This is an exception to the BWF rules and is an IASAS rule.

II. PROTESTS

All protests are to go through the Tournament Director or the Convention Director. (see section 1.8 XVII).

III. POST SECTION PLAY:

- After the round-robin league play, the 4th and 5th place teams and the 3rd and 6th place teams will participate in play-off seeding matches.
- After these matches, the standings will be reseeded for the semi-finals on day 3.
- On the morning of day 3, the 1st and 4th place teams and the 2nd and 3rd place teams will play in semi-final matches.
- There will be post-section play for the 5th and 6th ranked teams.
- The semi-finals losers play a consolation match for 3rd place.
- The semi-finals winners will play a championship match to decide 1st & 2nd place.

IV. THE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

A. Head to Head - If teams are still tied, go to B.

B. Match Difference (for three or more tied teams):

1. Add the total matches won and the total matches lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
2. Get the match difference of all the matches played of the teams involved in the tie. If still tied, go to C.

C. SET DIFFERENCE

Add the total games won and the total games lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.

D. POINT DIFFERENCE

1. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
2. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against of all the matches played by each of the teams involved in the tie and subtract. To decide the placing, teams will be placed according to the highest positive points gained.
