





Laundry

Each team will pick up a uniform basket at the laundry room on Field B after their games on Thursday and Friday. Uniforms should be placed in the basket and returned to the laundry room. They can be picked up in the laundry room the next morning. No laundry service will be available on Saturday. NOTE: Uniforms only, please. Non-uniform items in the laundry basket will be placed in a Lost & Found box.

Curfew

9:00 pm on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights and approximately 10:00 pm on Saturday night. If the tournament runs late curfew will be extended one hour after the end of the last activity of the evening.

Food

The main cafeteria will be open from 6:00 am until 1:00 pm with Thai and Western food available. After 1:00 pm only The Grind will be open until 5pm. Shoshanah, Subway, Baan Kimchi, Hot Dogs & Buns, and Emack & Bolio will be on sale during the event in the breezeway outside Rajendra Hall.

Gate Passes

Participants will receive a gate pass upon arrival at ISB. These passes must be presented to ISB security personnel when entering or leaving campus. Please note that these gate passes will be collected on Sunday morning.

Hospitality Room

The Dance Room on the second floor of the PE Building will be open for coaches, administrators and officials. It will be stocked daily with coffee, tea, drinks, snacks and fruit courtesy of the ISB Booster Club & ISB Athletics. Epicure will also provide a hot lunch for coaches, administrators and officials each day.

Athletes' Rest Area

The air-conditioned gymnasium in the Elementary School will be used as the athletes' rest area. We would like to keep these areas neat and clean. Please bring only water into the gym, no food or other drinks. Thank you in advance for keeping this area clean!!

Off-Limit Area

NOTE: The gymnastics area in the Sports Complex is OFF-LIMITS. Please stay out of this area at all times. Do note that any IASAS participant entering this area will be removed from the tournament.

Locker Rooms

The locker rooms and showers are located next to Rajendra Hall. You must provide your own towel, soap and shampoo for showers. Please DO NOT leave any bags or valuables in the locker room.

Warm-Up Area

The warm-up area will be on Fields A & D as well as in the batting cages. Each team should follow the warm-up schedule that is being distributed to coaches.

Medical Procedures



- In case of injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competitions, the site director, tournament director, or school nurse should be notified. The medical staff will be located across from Rajendra Hall. The nurses and medical personnel will be present and on-site for the duration of the competition.
- 2. An injured athlete should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site or tournament director and the nurse on duty.
- 3. The school nurses are permitted to issue students only non-prescription medication.
- 4. In case of an injury or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call ISB (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either host families or one of the tournament officials at their home as listed in this program.
- 5. In case of an emergency, there will be an ambulance available at the campus on all three days of the competition.

IASAS Softball Rules

I. RIILES

A. Rule Book:

ASA Official Rules of Softball (Amateur Softball Association)

B. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school. Games will be scheduled at 1 hour 45 minutes with the understanding that game times are approximate. In fact, subsequent games will start 15 minutes after the conclusion of the previous game. (05/06)

C. General Rules:

- The official IASAS ball for Boys: 12" with a .52 COR/max 300 lbs. compression. NOTE: This will become effective for the 2016 IASAS Tournament. For the 2015 tournament the ball for boys will be the 12" .44 COR/max 375 lbs. (4/14)
- 2. The official IASAS ball for Girls: 11" with a .44 COR/max 375 lbs. compression (05/05)
- 3. The team designated as 'home team' in the finals will be the team with the highest ranking after the round robin including the mini-series if one is necessary. In the case of identical records, head to head will determine the home team. If they have not played, a coin toss will decide.
- The dimension of the field for the boys' tournament, when possible will meet the ASA rules of a 275/300 range. (5/99)
- Bats that are approved by the ASA June 1st each year can be used for the following twelve months. (4/08)
- Teams must play all five rounds of the Round Robin even if the last game is a repeat of the Championship Game (5/00).
- IASAS Softball is designated as a Class B
 Division and will follow the ASA Rules
 governing Class B, especially as they relate to
 home run limits. (4/04)

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

- A. A team may play with a minimum of nine (9) players instead of ten (10) players before forfeiting the game.
- B. A game will be called when the home team has a 15 run lead after 4½ innings with the home team coming to bat. (5/00)
- C. A pitching strike zone mat will be employed. The strike mat will be considered as home plate when a player is coming in to score (04/2012).
- D. The strike zone mat will be a 22 inches wide, 30 inches long and will be placed such that it will cover and be flush with the front of home plate. (04/2012) The mat should be made of a rubber substance, for safety reasons. (5/96)
- E. No new inning may start after one hour and 30-minutes during preliminary rounds providing the game is regulation. Tie-games will be continued using individual game tie-breaker rule until a winner is determined. Championship games only will consist of seven innings or until a tie is broken with no time limit. Consolation games will follow the same tie-breaking procedures as round robin.
- F. The individual game tie-breaker will be employed starting at the end of the regulation game, each offensive team will start with a runner on second base. This runner will be the player due to bat 10th in the innings (for 11th if an EP is used).
- G. There will be an extra safety base at first base on both fields. (5/96)
- H. When games are modified such that each batter starts with a 1-1 count, a third strike foul will count as a strikeout upon the second foul ball after the count has reached strike two. (10/10)
- Coaches have the option to bat all 12 players on the Roster. (05/06)
- J. The ball must be delivered with perceptible arc and reach a height of at least six feet from the ground, while not exceeding a maximum height of twelve feet from the ground. (04/2012)

III. ROSTERS

Rosters (up to 12 boys and 12 girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- D. Birth date:
- E. Uniform number;
- F. Housing preference, and
- G. List of bats (manufacturer, model name, etc) (05/07)

IV. ENTRIES

Not applicable.

V. SUBSTITUTION

As in the A.S.A. rule book.

VI. FACILITIES

Two softball fields are required, one of which must be on the high school campus with some spectator seating. The other field should either be on campus or be near the high school.

VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

Helmets are required for all IASAS Softball games. (4/04)

VIII. UNIFORMS

As in the A.S.A. rule book. (The hat rule will be enforced).

An Arabic whole number (0 - 99) of contrasting color, at least six inches (15.24cm) high must be worn and visible on the back of all uniforms shirts. (10/06)

IX. TIE BREAKING FOR ROUND-ROBIN RANKING

When there is a tie in the ranking list and three or more teams are involved and the tie cannot be broken under the head to head format (see "Resolution of a Tie" in the general rules section) e.g. each team has one win and one loss under a three team head to head comparison (X beats Y; Y beats Z; Z beats X), then the teams involved will enter a playoff series wherein they will play a game against each other team involved in a tie. These games will be called playoff games and teams will draw for identification purposes i.e. Team A, Team B Team C. etc. (see draw below).

Playoff Games:

- A. Will consist of one inning of normal play. Each inning will start with the 10th scheduled batter (11th using an EP) for that inning starting on second base. After the playoff round robin, the team with the most wins will be ranked highest and so on. No warm up time will be provided for these playoff games. (05/2015)
- B. Should two teams be tied after the one inning, they will continue to play extra innings until a decision is reached.
- C. If all the teams are still tied, then the playoff series will be replayed and the entire procedure repeated. However, the order of games and designation of Home Team will change according to the following matrix.

X. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. However, it is recommended that there be three (3) umpires for every game if possible.

XI. PROTESTS

See 'Protest' section of Handbook.

XII. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place.

The 3rd and 4th ranked teams will play for 3rd place.

There will be no post section play for the 5^{th} and 6^{th} ranked teams.

It is recommended that Championship Games should not be played concurrently. If a Championship game is scheduled at a given time, but a previous game runs over time, the start of the next Championship Game will be delayed. (However, the Tournament Director has the right to moderate the schedule if the weather or fading light becomes a factor). (5/00)





Past Champions-IASAS Softball









IASAS Softball History

The IASAS organization kicked off in the fall of 1982 with the first IASAS Softball tournament taking place in Jakarta in the spring of 1983. The schedule was affected by torrential rains (a common theme in IASAS Softball), 1983 marked the only time that co-champions were crowned, as the SAS and JIS girls shared the title. Interestingly, in those days in Jakarta, they lit fires to dry the dirt infields (see the photo below)!

As we enter the 33rd and final IASAS Slowpitch Softball Championships, it is worthy to note that all IASAS teams, boys and girls alike, have experienced the thrill of winning an IASAS Softball tournament. Of the 11 IASAS sports, only volleyball and softball have this distinction. What marks nearly all of these IASAS champs is the pile-up celebration at the end of the gold medal game (see photo below).

Victories aside, incredible memories abound from the 32 tournaments that have preceded this one. Among these are:

*TAIPEI 1988: A cold, steady rain put IASAS '88 in jeopardy as all of the Friday games were postponed. One field was also underwater and out of commission. Beginning at 7am on Saturday, all of the day 2 and day 3 games + the championship games were played on one field with a 45 minute time limit and each batter starting with a 1-1 count. When the ISM girls recorded the 3rd and final out of their victory over ISB, it was after midnight and marked a remarkable, 17-hour day of IASAS Softball.

*KUALA LUMPUR 1995: A violent thunderstorm struck the Malaysian capital just as the girls' championship game was ending. The game was called with two outs in the top of the 7th inning as lighting and thunder crashed all around. The boys' game between TAS and JIS was suspended in the 2nd inning, and subsequently could not be completed as the ISKL field had no lights. TAS, the round robin leader, were named champions, as this marked the only time that a boys' gold medal game could not be played.

*[AKARTA 2000: Again rain played a part as a rain delay caused both the girls and boys to play their championship games at almost the same time. As it would turn out, the ISB girls completed their close victory just moments before TAS' Adam Ulfers had his game winning single in the bottom of the 7th inning to give TAS their gold medal. Many coaches and spectators stood between the two diamonds on the old JIS upper field and were able to watch both games concurrently. A softball fans delight!

*TAIPEI 2004: SARS cancelled all of the third season IASAS competitions in 2003, so the 2004 tournament was memorable as it brought back IASAS to third season. It was again cold and rainy in Taipei, but the TAS bats were blazing, and their 13 home runs in the championship game brought home gold to the home team.

*SINGAPORE 2007: IASAS celebrated its 25th year and SAS hosted an incredible event that featured IASAS Softball, IASAS Badminton, and IASAS Track & Field all at the same time. It was amazing to be able to finish a softball game, catch the long jump or a relay on the track, and then head indoors to watch an IASAS Badminton match. Fittingly both SAS softball teams won the gold. Incidentally, this format reminded old-timers of the early days of IASAS when all of the season's sports were hosted at one school.

IASAS participants over the 33 years of IASAS Softball certainly have their own memorable moments that they cherish, but as we look towards baseball and fastpitch in 2017, it is fun to take note of the amazing moments that IASAS Softball has brought to the IASAS community since 1983.
