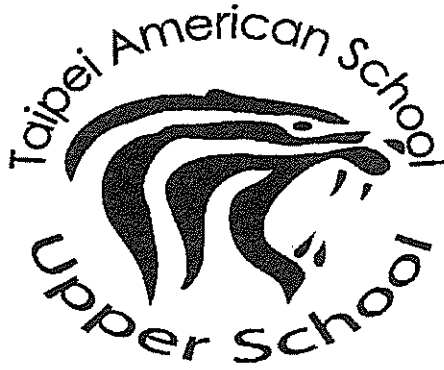

Medical Procedures

For any medical emergencies or concerns, please follow the guidelines below:

1. In case of injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competition, the site director, tournament director, athletic trainer or school nurse should be notified.
2. An injured athlete should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site director and athletic trainer on duty.
3. The school nurses are not permitted to issue students any medication (not even aspirin) unless they are accompanied by their coach or trip administrator.
4. In case of an injury, or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call TAS (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either their host families or one of the tournament officials as listed in the program.

All spectators must remain off the basketball courts and behind the gym stanchions at all times

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

Each participant and his/her parent must sign and return this form before traveling or hosting, by so doing they acknowledge that they fully understand and agree to abide by these RULES & GUIDELINES.

PARTICIPANTS

- Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations and violations of the "off-limits" areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event. (4/01)

When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / "off limits" areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- i The student may no longer participate in that convention.
- ii The student will be sent home at his/her parents' expense if it is feasible to do so.
- iii Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - Appropriate counseling will be required.
 - The student will be required to spend *all* free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
 - The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, i.e. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
 - The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
 - Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.
 - Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
 - Other Individual School's Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
- iv For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.
- v If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.
- vi Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
 - Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
 - Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
 - All visiting students must return to the host families' house before curfew-as set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
 - All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
 - No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip Administrator.
 - The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
 - Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
 - Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.
 - All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them.

HOST FAMILIES

- All host families will be provided with complete Tournament/Convention details (schedules, curfews, policies, procedures, emergency phone numbers for coaches and important tournament personnel, etc.
- Host parents/guardians will not offer housing unless one of the parents/guardians is present for the duration of the tournament/convention.
- Hosts are expected to cooperate with Tournament/Convention Director in ensuring student compliance with all IASAS policies relating to participation.
- Any student who shows reluctance to fully comply with the above rules and regulations shall be reported to the Tournament/Convention Director who will report the matter to the student's coach and Administrator in charge with the expectation that action will be taken.

Basketball (Trial)

I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

F.I.B.A. (latest edition):

- B. Schools hosting basketball must have visible 24-second clocks. (10/01)
- C. The official balls are the Molten GG7 (boys) and the Molten GG6 (girls). (04/13)

II. RULE EXCEPTION

- A. Recommended uniform numbers for IASAS will be 1- 15, 21-25 (10/03).

B. There will be no dunking during warm-up time before the games. The penalty will be a technical foul, with two shots awarded to the opposing team. (5/96)

C. Tournament Format

IASAS Basketball 2015 will be a round robin tournament followed by a seeded bracket. After the Round Robin, team will be seeded 1-6 based on standings. The Play-Off games will be between the #3 and #6 seed of the Round Robin and the #4 and #5 seed of the Round Robin. The #3 seed team will play in the premier facility. The same gender play-offs will take place simultaneously, so that schools can support both of their teams. The Semi-Final games will be played between the #1 seed and the lowest seeded winner of the Play-Off games and the #2 seed and the highest seeded winner of the Play-off games. The #1 seed will play in the premier facility. The same gender play-offs will take place simultaneously, so that schools can support both of their teams. (04/14)

- D. All games shall consist of four periods of eight minutes. In the round robin portion of the tournament halftime will be five minutes in length with a one-minute interval between the first and second periods and between the third and fourth periods. In subsequent matches the halftime interval will be ten minutes and the between period intervals will be two minutes. (04/14)

- E. When one team leads the other in score by 30 points or more in the second half, the game clock will become a running clock. The clock shall be stopped only for a charged timeout, an injury/blood or disqualification, and immediately following the reporting of a foul if free throws are to be administered.

1. After reporting a shooting foul the official will signal the timer to stop the clock. (This will be signaled by the official to the timer after reporting the foul)
2. Once the official signals the timer to stop the clock, it will be started when the free throw ends if the last free throw is missed (when it is certain the try will not be successful or when the try touches the floor or any player), or when the ball is at the disposal of the opponent if the last free throw is successful (available to a player after a goal and the official begins the throw-in count) (04/13)

VI. FACILITIES

Two basketball courts are required. Both teams should have their pre-game warm-up in front of their opponent's (05/06) bench, and the home team will face the clock in the second half. (5/96)

VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

As specified in F.I.B.A. rules. Exception: A smaller women's basketball will be used for all IASAS women's tournament games. (5/93)

VIII. UNIFORMS

All teams must have light and dark uniforms. Numbers on front and back with plain numbers, of a solid color contrasting with the color of the shirt.

Numbers on back shall be at least 20cm high.
Numbers on front shall be at least 10 cm high
The numbers shall be at least 2 cm wide. (10/06)

IX. OFFICIALS

- A. The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate tournaments.
- B. Translation services will need to be provided to ensure effective communication between host country and English speakers. (10/01)
- C. The official scorer must be an adult. (10/01)

X. TIE BREAKER

Tie-breaker as stipulated in the F.I.B.A. rules.

XI. PROTEST

See "Protest", section XVII of "Organizations and General Regulations", in handbook.

XII. POST SECTION PLAY

- After the round-robin league play, the 4th and 5th place teams and the 3rd and 6th place teams will participate in Play-Off seeding matches.
- After these matches (matches 31-34, see section XIV) the standings will be reseeded for the Semi-Final matches on day 3.
- On the morning of day 3 the 1st and 4th place teams and the 2nd and 3rd place teams will play in the Semi-Final matches (matches 35-38)
- There will be a 5th Place Consolation Match for the 5th and 6th ranked teams (matches 39 & 40)
- The losers of matches 35-38 will play Bronze Medal matches for 3rd place (matches 41 & 42)
- The winners of matches 35-38 will play Championship Matches to decide 1st & 2nd place (matches 43 & 44)
- In the Play-Off rounds for both boys and girls – the highest seed will play in the premier facility- each gender 4&5, 3&6 will play at the same time. The order to reflect the profiled gender [04/14]

Official Basketball Rules changes (effective as of 1st October 2014)

1. Art. 24.7 No-charge semi-circle areas

Purpose: To provide the offensive player with more protection while he is in the air on the shot for the goal.

New wording Art. 24., last sentence: The no-charge semi-circles are part of the no-charge semi-circle areas.

2. Art. 18 Time-out

Purpose: To avoid the excessive number of time-outs at the end of the game.

New wording Art. 18.2.5: Each team may be granted:

- Two (2) time-outs during the first half,
- Three (3) time-outs during the second half with a maximum of two (2) of these time-outs in the last two (2) minutes of the second half,
- One (1) time-out during each extra period.

3. Art. 29 Twenty-four seconds

Purpose: To speed up the game and allow for more attack/shots during the game.

New wording: New Art. 29.2.2.

Following an offensive rebound after a shot for a field goal or after a last or only free throw, the twenty-four (24) second clock shall be set to fourteen (14) seconds.

The current Art. 29.2.2 will become Art. 29.2.3

4. Art. 38 Technical Foul

Purpose: The current penalty is considered too excessive.

New wording: Art. 38.4.2. Penalty: One (1) free throw shall be awarded to the opponents, followed by:

- A throw-in at the centre line extended, opposite the scorer's table.
- A jump ball in the centre circle to start the first period.

5. Art. 38 Technical foul

Purpose: To provide with a stronger penalty in case of players who are not obeying the rules of sportsmanship thus repeatedly damaging the image of the game.

New wording: New Art. 38.3.3

A player shall be disqualified when charged with two (2) technical fouls.
The current Art. 38.3.3 and 38.3.4 will become Art. 38.3.4 and 38.3.5
