Medical Procedures

For any medical emergencies or concerns, please follow the guidelines below:

- In case of injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competition, the site director, tournament director, or school nurse should be notified.
- An injured athlete should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site director and nurse on duty.
- The school nurses are not permitted to issue students any medication (not even aspirin) unless they are accompanied by their coach or trip administrator.
- In case of an injury, or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call TAS (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either their host families or one of the tournament officials at their homes as listed in the program.

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

Each participant and his/her parent must sign and return this form before traveling or hosting, by so doing they acknowledge that they fully understand and agree to abide by these RULES & GUIDELINES.

PARTICIPANTS

Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations
and violations of the "off-limits" areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any
IASAS event. (4/01)

When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / "off limits" areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- The student may no longer participate in that convention.
- ii The student will be sent home at his/her parents' expense if it is feasible to do so.
- iii Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - Appropriate counseling will be required.
 - The student will be required to spend all free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in
 a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the
 determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
 - The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, ie. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
 - The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
 - Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.
 - Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the
 activity.
 - Other Individual School's Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
- For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.

If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.

- vi Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
- Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of the local environment
 will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
- 3. Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
- 4. All visiting students must return to the host families' house before curfew-as set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
- 5. All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
- No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct communication with the
 respective coach/sponsor or trip Administrator.
- 7. The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
- 8. Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
- 9. Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.
- 10. All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them,

HOST FAMILIES

- All host families will be provided with complete Tournament/Convention details (schedules, curfews, policies, procedures, emergency phone numbers for coaches and important tournament personnel, etc.
- Host parents/guardians will not offer housing unless one of the parents/guardians is present for the duration of the tournament/convention.
- Hosts are expected to cooperate with Tournament/Convention Director in ensuring student compliance with all IASAS
 policies relating to participation.
- 4. Any student who shows reluctance to fully comply with the above rules and regulations shall be reported to the Tournament/Convention Director who will report the matter to the student's coach and Administrator in charge with the expectation that action will be taken.

Golf

I. RULES

The tournament shall follow the rules of golf for stroke play and match play as determined by the United States Golf Association and the Royal and Ancient Rules of Golf.

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

- A. Always hit a provisional ball if in doubt as to whether original ball is out of bounds.
- B. In the event of a controversial lie, etc., if a marshal is not available to make a ruling, the player should hit a 2nd ball and score both. The committee can then later decide when the player finishes the round which of the two balls was played within the rules of golf.
- C. Shotgun start whenever possible.
- D. The committee will determine before the start of the tournament whether boys go off of blue or white tees, and whether girls go off red or white tees.

III. ROSTERS

Rosters (up to 6 boys and 6 girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- Name
- Grade
- Passport nationality
- Birth date
- Ranking (1 6 for establishing foursomes)
- · Housing preferences/needs
- · Allergies/Medical Issues

IV. SUBSTITUTIONS

There are no substitutes or alternates. All players are expected to play all three days. In the event of a player being unable to play due to sickness or injury, the team must take the best scores from a reduced squad on days 1 and 2, and forfeit one match play match on day 3 (see X. Tournament Scoring).

V. FACILITIES

Par 72 golf course is advisable, although par 70 or 71 is acceptable depending on availability of courses in the host school's area.

VI. UNIFORMS

Each team member will wear the team's golf shirt(s) during play throughout the event.

VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

Students bring their own clubs, balls, and all equipment. Preference is to leave bags at venue overnight between rounds if possible. Scores will be posted by the host school near the clubhouse. Range finders may not be used.

VIII. OFFICIALS

The host school will supply a tournament director who will oversee the competition and settle any discrepancies. Whenever possible, the tournament director will consult with a committee consisting of the athletic director of the host school, the head coach of each team, and a home course pro or official if available for any rule interpretations, decisions on scoring, or changes in format due to weather or other conditions.

The club where the championship is being contested works with tournament director to ensure that play is not too slow. Coaches are to marshal play on individual holes and make judgment calls on questionable rulings to the best of their ability, subject to review by the committee.

IX. TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

Day 1 foursomes will be arranged according to rankings as submitted prior to the tournament. Day 2 foursomes will be arranged according to the gross scores from day 1. Foursomes for day 1 and day 2 will be made up of golfers from four different schools.

Day 3 match play foursomes will be organized with the 5th/6th golfers going off together, then the 3rd/4th golfers, and finally the 1st/2nd golfers.

X. TOURNAMENT SCORING

<u>First two days</u>: gross score of top four players <u>each day</u> is the team aggregate score. Different players can contribute each day. Gross scores after two days determine the team rankings for the day three match play. If there is a tie in the ranking after day two, the tie is broken by comparing the day 2 scores of the fifth players of the tied teams. If still tied, then go to the sixth players, then the day 1 scores of the fifth and sixth players in that order.

Day 3: Low teams 1 & 2 play for gold, teams 3 & 4 play for bronze, teams 5 & 6 play for placing only. Day three is match play with lowest gross scoring players from each team for the first two days in match play competition; second lowest playing each other, etc. 1 point for match play win; one-half point for a draw; 0 for a loss. All six matches count. Winner of the match is the team with most points on day 3. In case of a tie, the team with the lower ranking from days 1 & 2 will be declared the winner. Note: individual medals are based on low gross scoring for days 1 & 2 only (see XII. Awards below).

XI. PROTESTS

For disputed play or scoring, a decision is made with or without marshal's aid depending on availability of marshal (see II. Rule Exceptions); protests are settled at the end of the round by the committee <u>before</u> scores are made official.

XII. AWARDS

The same awards are given to both Boys and Girls teams.

- D. We recognize IASAS records for low scores achieved either total strokes for first two days or in the case of playing a course with less than par 72, strokes vs. par.
- E. Teams are not eligible to win team awards if they have an incomplete team i.e. 3 boys or 3 girls (FEWER THAN 4 GOLFERS) because they can't get an aggregate total for the first two days. Teams with 4 or 5 golfers must forfeit matches on day three for each missing golfer (if there are only 4 golfers on a team, match play matches 5 and 6 must be forfeited).
- F. Best Individual Golfers: Top three finishers in boys and girls for stroke play days 1 and 2 receive medals, 1st-6th place receive all tournament;

NOTE: When ties occur in an individual medal event, the medal award for a position will be made based on the number of places above the awardee. For example, if two competitors tie for first place, the next award would be the third place award. If two competitors tie for second place, the next award will be for fourth place.

All awards are to be distributed at the Closing Ceremony.
