IASAS Badminton Rules

INTERSCHOLASTIC ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIA SCHOOLS

II. RULES

A. Rule Book:

BWF. (latest edition).(4/09)

B. Meet Rules:

1. Each school fields one boys' team and one girls' team.
2. On each team 3 members will play singles and 4 will play doubles.
3. Players must be ranked according to ability for singles and doubles #1, #2 and #3. Number #1 ranking being the top player. Line-ups will be given to the Site Director at the start of each match, and cannot be changed during the match. (05/05)
4. The #1 ranked players from each school will play each other, the #2 ranked players will play each other, and the #3 ranked players will play each other, in the round robin. Once a player or doubles team has been assigned a ranking, he/she cannot change ranking during the tournament.
5. Each team match will consist of 3 singles and 2 doubles, with the winning team decided by the best of 5 matches. All matches must be played.
6. The 8th player substitute will play exhibition matches. The 8th player may substitute into the tournament at any position if a player is unable to participate. If a player is replaced, they can take no further part in the tournament. No player can substitute during a match. No players can switch ranking once the tournament has started. To qualify for All-Tournament a player must participate in all five matches (05/00). The 8th player (alternate) with the best win-loss record should receive All-Tournament recognition and a chevron. (4/04). The 8th player will be eligible to play at either the #3 singles or the #2 doubles position, as a "free switch" during the tournament. At such a switch the original #3 singles or #2 doubles person would play in the Alternate match and the 8th player will play in the new position. Only the originally designated 8th player is eligible to play in any of the 3 mentioned positions. If the original 8th person is used because of an injury, at any position, the "free switch" is no longer possible, since they must play in that position for the remainder of the tournament. No All-Tournament Award can be awarded to a position that

has been substituted in singles or doubles as a free switch. (05/06)

7. The tournament will be run on a round-robin format. In the round robin matches games will be played first to 21 points (capped, no need to win by two points). The round-robin league standing of the teams will be determined by their win-loss record with all teams advancing to a post section play, see VIII. POSTSECTION PLAY. In case of a tie following round-robin play, rules under IX. TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDING will apply. The post section matches will be played as usual to 21 points (win by two points, no cap).
8. There will be a ten-minute warm-up before each match.
9. Players will call their own lines and keep score.
10. Players must report to the main desk before the start of their match.
11. A player reporting more than fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled match time will be declared a walk over.
12. Coaches will be allowed to consult with their players for 60 seconds during each game when the leading scorer reaches 11 points, and between sets (04/10). Coaches will not be allowed on the courts for consultation unless there is no outside access.
13. Order of play will be as follows:
 - a. #3 Singles
 - b. #2 Doubles
 - c. Alternates
 - d. #2 Singles
 - e. #1 Doubles
 - f. #1 SinglesPlease note that whenever possible matches a, b and c should be played concurrently on three courts followed by matches d, e and f. (04/12)
14. In the event of an injury during a match, only one 5 minute injury time for treatment will be allowed for the duration of that match to determine if the player can continue. The Site Director should monitor the situation. (5/02)
15. The right to towel-off and/or drink during a match can only be initiated by the serving team. (5/98)

16. When illegal serves are not contested by the opposing player, the coach of the opposing player is allowed to summon the official to the court for review. The official will inform the player of serving error(s) for player correction. This would be an exception to BWF rules and become an IASAS rule. (05/00)

I. ROSTERS (modified 05/00)

Rosters (eight boys and eight girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament. The roster form should include the following information:

1. Name;
2. Grade;
3. Passport nationality;
4. Birth date;
5. Housing preference.
6. Designate position (04/09)

II. FACILITIES

- 1. A minimum of 6 courts are required.
- 2. Shuttlecocks will be provided by the host.

V. UNIFORMS

Each member of the team will wear the same uniform. The team uniform must be worn for the entire match. No tank tops are allowed. (5/02)

VII. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate the meet.

VI. PROTESTS

All protests are to go through the Tournament Director or to the Convention Director. (see section 8 XVII).

II. SCORING

It is recommended that when possible, flip scoreboards be used at each court. (5/99)

III. POST SECTION PLAY

After the round-robin league play, the 4th and 5th place teams and the 3rd and 6th place teams will participate in play-off seeding matches.

After these matches (matches 16-19 see section II) the standings will be reseeded for the play-off games on day 3.

On the morning of day 3 the 1st and 4th place teams and the 2nd and 3rd place teams will play in the semifinal matches (matches 20-23)

There will be post section play for the 5th and 6th

ranked teams (matches 24 & 25)

- The losers of matches 20-23 play a consolation match for 3rd place (matches 26 & 27)
- The winners of matches 20-23 will play a championship match to decide 1st & 2nd place (matches 28 & 29)

Rounds 16-19 for both boys and girls – the highest seed will play in the premier facility- each gender 4&5, 3&6 will play at the same time. The order to reflect the profiled gender

IX. TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

A. Head to Head

(Definition of Head to Head can be found in Section L of Convention Organization.)

If after L.3 teams are still tied, go to B.

B. Match difference (for three or more tied teams):

1. Add the total matches won and the total matches lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
2. Get the match difference of all the matches played of the teams involved in the tie. If still tied, go to C.

C. Set Difference:

Add the total games won and the total games lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.

D. Point Difference:

1. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
2. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against of all the matches played by each of the teams involved in the tie and subtract. To decide the placing, teams will be placed according to the highest positive points gained.

- Best #3 Singles (1 boy & 1 girl)
- Best #1 Doubles pair (2 boys & 2 girls)
- Best #2 Doubles pair (2 boys & 2 girls)
- Best Alternate Singles (1 boy & 1 girl)

The All-tournament award is given to the school with the best win-loss record in each category. To qualify for the all-tournament award, players must have played in all five matches in the round robin section. (04/09)
The tie breaker for All-Tournament players should be the same as the tie breaker for league standings as noted 9.2 IX. (5/98)



XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Scheduling of Matches:

Matches between schools should be at least 1.5 hours apart.

2. Umpires:

Provide an umpire for each venue to facilitate solving difficulties in on court decision making.

3. Scorers:

Provide one unofficial scorer per court to allow spectators to follow the game.

Access to Campus

Vehicles without JIS stickers are not allowed to drive into JIS. Pedestrian access to the Cilandak Campus is via the Terogong Gate (Gate 1), located on Jalan Terogong Raya No. 33, up the hill from Hotel Kristal. Turn left as you leave the hotel.

Should you choose to walk to or from the Kristal, be alert, keep your valuables secure and carry your handbag away from traffic.

If walking into the campus, you will need to exchange a photo ID for a Dragon gate pass. This is your temporary JIS ID. Please guard it as you would any ID badge and show it to Security personnel when passing through JIS security checkpoints. Remember to return this pass and claim your ID before you leave campus.

Airport Departure Tax

Keep in mind that all travelers from the Soekarno-Hatta International airport are required to pay Rp 150,000 upon departure. Make sure that you retain enough Rupiah notes for this. You may also pay in US dollars (approximately \$18) but change will be given in Rupiah.

ATM and Banks

ATM, Bank and Post Office facilities are available in H module at the front of school (behind the Parent Welcome Lounge).

ATMs are also available at Hero Supermarket, next to the Kristal Hotel as well at the Pondok Indah Mall (PIM).

Awards Dinner

All parents are invited to the Awards Dinner on Saturday evening, 7:30 PM at the Wantilan 3. This is on the third floor of the Cafeteria, in the center of the HS and MS campus. Dinner and awards will run concurrently. IASAS delegates enjoy a complimentary dinner. Tickets for parents will be sold at the door for Rp. 100,000. You do not need to purchase a ticket if you will not be having dinner. There will be seating available for parents who want to view the awards, but who do not wish to dine.

The Booster Hut

Come visit the Booster Hut for food and drinks, to pick up JIS souvenirs like our ever-popular hoodies and pajamas or to enjoy one of the Hut's signature treats – Caramelitas, Vanilla Bean-Banana Cake or Red Velvet cupcakes. Follow the Booster Hut signs. (Open 9AM to 3PM, Monday to Friday).

Cell Phones and Telephones

You can get prepaid SIM cards for your mobile phone at 7-11, which is walking distance from both JIS and the Kristal Hotel or at the small kiosk near the checkout counter at Hero supermarket. Most kiosks sell standard, micro (iphone/ipad) and nano (iphone 5) SIM cards. You can also buy top-up value cards (pulsa) from the same stores.

When dialing from a cellphone to a landline, use the standard format: + (country code) (area code) (phone number). To call a local number you would dial +62 21 (phone number).

To make a local call from a landline, simply dial the number with no prefixes. For direct international call from a landline, dial 001 or 007 + country code + area code + phone number.



Currency Exchange

Only exchange US\$ or other currencies at banks or at foreign currency exchange counters inside malls. At JIS, the bank is located in the H-module, near the front of school and is open from 8:30AM -2PM. There is also a foreign exchange counter inside Hero near Kristal.

Generally, foreign exchange counters give better rates than banks. Keep in mind that US\$ bills must be unmarked and uncreased - in mint condition. If there is so much as a bent corner on your note, it cannot be exchanged at full value or it may be refused outright. US Dollar bills circulated before 1999 as well as those whose serial numbers start with the letters A - G will not be accepted. No such restrictions apply to other currencies.

Food and Drinks on campus

Drinks and a selection of snacks are sold concession stand on the second floor of the gym. Food vendors, specially brought in for IASAS are located outside the gym. The Booster Hut serves drinks and snacks, including popular home-baked treats. The Main cafeteria has hot meals, snacks and drinks. The cafeteria uses a cashless payment system; you may purchase vouchers from the e-terminals at the cafeteria. Follow the signs to get to the areas mentioned above.

Hero – next to Kristal Hotel and in Pondok Indah Mall I

Food Hall – at the Basement of the Sogo Department Store in Pondok Indah Mall II

Carrefour - Jl. TB. Simatupang No. 1, Lebak Bulus. This is the closest hypermart to JIS; good for making bulk purchases

Hospitals and Clinics

Pondok Indah Hospital - Jl Metro Duta Kav UE. Ph: (021) 765-1883, (021) 765-7525. Located near Pondok Indah Plaza, this is the hospital closest to JIS. Most staff and all doctors speak English.

International SOS - Jl Puri Sakti #10, Cipete. Ph (021) 750-5559. Ambulance service and emergencies: 021-506001. For both medical and dental concerns. This is about 20 minutes away from JIS. All staff and doctors speak English and there is an expat medical consultant available. SOS facilitates referrals to Singapore as well as emergency transport (airlift).

r. Budimulia Dental Clinic - Jalan Gedung Hijau 1 No 4, Pondok Indah. Ph (021) 7652721. If you have a dental emergency, this is the closest dental clinic to JIS. Dr Budimulia and Dr. Amelia speak English.

Internet/Wifi Access

The air conditioned High School Library will be open from 8 am -5:30 pm on Thursday and Friday and from 8 am to 12 noon on Saturday. A courtesy bank of computers will be available for visitors. The username is: iasas password iasas2013.

For wireless access on campus password, go to your wifi settings and select @JIS. Then open your browser. You will be automatically directed to the JIS login page. Type in username: iasas password : iasas2013.



Local Customs to Keep In Mind

Indonesians dress well, even for just going to the mall. Smart casual is the norm. Dress modestly. Long shorts and sleeveless tops are okay but Daisy Dukes and tank tops (short shorts and spaghetti straps) are not.

Never use your left hand to give or receive items nor raise it in greeting. The left hand is considered unclean in Indonesian culture and to use it as above is a great insult.

Open displays of anger and displeasure are frowned upon. If you find yourself in a frustrating situation, take a deep breath, smile, excuse yourself (say, "maaf"), walk away to calm down and return when you feel composed.

Lost and Found

Enquire at the Information desk. At the end of the day, all found items will be kept at the Checkpoint, next to the Booster Hut. The Checkpoint closes on Friday at 4:30 PM.

Rest Area for Parents

You can rest and recharge in air-conditioned comfort in the Wantilan Cafeteria. Follow the posted signs. You may also choose to rest in the High School Library. Computers are available for your use. Follow the posted signs.

Restaurants

There are many excellent restaurants in Jakarta although sadly most are located in the city, about an hour away from JIS. There is a selection of good eating places nearby. Ask the parents at the Information Centre for their recommendations. Should you choose to venture outside Pondok Indah, remember that traffic in Jakarta can be daunting, especially if it is raining. Factor that into any schedule you may have. See "Shopping" section for details and addresses of the malls. Restaurants near JIS include:

Peppenero - Plaza Pondok Indah 2 Blok BA 25-26, Jl. Metro Pondok Indah. Italian food. Great value for money.

PIM 1 and 2 - There is good selection of restaurants at PIM. **Pizza Marzano** serves Italian food. **Kinara** is a popular Indian restaurant in Kemang with a satellite branch inside the Food Hall at the basement of Sogo Department Store in PIM 2. **Sushi Tei** is always reliable for Japanese. **Duck King** is a Chinese restaurant renowned for their roast duck. **Din Tai Fung** another Chinese restaurant, specializes in dumplings. **Bakmi GM**, a local favorite, has very good Indonesian stir-fried noodles. The "pangsit goreng" is a must try. **Area 51**, a new food court in PIM, has many good fast food restaurants like **Yoshinoya Beef Bowl**, **Fat Burger and Pepper Lunch**. There are lots of folks who claim the local donut chain **J Co Donuts** is better than **Krispy Kreme** both of which have branches at PIM, **Bakerzin** is a casual dining bistro with great desserts. **Outback Steakhouse** is the go-to place for steaks and ribs. These are a just a few of the options at PIM

Cilandak Town Square aka Citos (pronounced Chee-tos) - Plenty of casual dining restaurants

Gandaria - a very wide selection of restaurants, set in a path reminiscent of old Batavia, meandering around the mall. Some standouts are **May Star Chinese** restaurant, **Kafe Betawi** (Indonesian), **Munchees** (casual dining), **The Butcher** (steaks and burgers), **Basilico** (Italian), **Abgujung** (Korean). There is also a very good and interesting food court

ask 10 women in Jakarta for the best place to shop and you'll get 10 different answers. This section highlights popular stores that are relatively close to JIS or that offer one-stop shopping for local items and handicrafts. Most malls open at 10 am and close at 10 pm. Store hours for individual shops vary but generally, most business hours are 11 am to 5 pm.

Pondok Indah Mall (aka "PIM") – open 10-10, Jl Metro Pondok Indah Blok 3B; about 10-15 min by taxi. Houses department stores, cinemas, supermarkets, restaurants and eateries including the ever-popular Krispy Kreme donuts

Cilandak Town Square aka Citos (pronounced "Chee-tos") - Jl TB Simatupang, Cilandak; about 10-15 min by taxi. An open air mall with shops, restaurants, cinema, supermarket. There is also a mini bazaar on Thursdays

Gandaria City - Jl Sultan Iskandar Muda No 8, Kebayoran Lama. A new mall, with interesting local boutiques side by side with familiar chain stores. They also have a very wide selection of restaurants, set in a path reminiscent of old Batavia, meandering around the mall.

Pasaraya Grande – Jl Inskandarsyah II, #2, Blok II; 30-40 mins by taxi. A large store with 6 levels. Two levels are dedicated to Indonesian arts, handicrafts and batik

Batik Canting – by appointment only: Jl Niaga Hijau IX/24; 15 mins from JIS. The owner, Ibu Hartati, has very high end Cirebon art jackets and batik. Call for an appointment: (021)740-2651

Kemang Raya - This street houses many shops including Fandiasta (pearls), ChicMart (silver jewelry, Asian handicrafts) and Bin House (designer batik scarves and clothing), to name a few

Spas and Salons

As with many cities in Asia, Jakarta is a salon and spa heaven. Massages are inexpensive and can be a great way to unwind after a long day. Make sure to try a "cream bath". Contrary to the name, this is an indulgent hair-conditioning treatment, where essential oils and creams are massaged into the hair and scalp. A shoulder, back and arm massage follows. Blissful! If you need refreshing and recharging, try a "Lulur" (body scrub). It will leave your skin glowing. Calling ahead for reservations is recommended.

Bersih Sehat - Jl. Metro Pondok Indah, Jakarta Selatan, Jakarta - (021) 750-1342. Traditional Indonesian lulur and massage by well-trained masseuses. Very clean and popular. If you have time, the pre-massage Lulur (body scrub) is a must try

Jamu - Jl Cipete VIII, #94B, Cipete, 021-765-9691/9693 [15-25 min from JIS] cream bath, manicure, pedicure, massage, waxing, facials

KMD Hair Salon – at the Kristal Hotel, 021-7581-8027 cut & color, manicure, pedicure, cream bath

Ranggon Feliz – Cilandak Tengah 3 #3; Cipete, 021-769-4338 [15-25 mins from JIS] cream bath, manicure, pedicure, waxing, massage, reflexology.

Relax Living – Pondok Indah Plaza II/BA 46, Jl Metro Duta Niaga, 021-765-4606 foot massage and reflexology

Use only Blue Bird or Silver Bird taxis. Blue Birds are compact sedans whilst Silver Birds are executive (Crowns) or luxury (Mercedes Benz) Town Cars. To book a taxi, call +62 21-798-1234 and specify which type you want. Generally taxis will be available at the Terogong entrance after the last game each day. You may also call the booking line or ask a JIS guard to flag one in the street.



Tipping

At restaurants, a tip of Rp10,000 - 20,000 per person in your dining party is sufficient for most dining places that have sit down service. You do not need to tip at fastfood counters and food courts.

For salon services, a tip of Rp 20,000 per person for salon and spa services are good, however, if you get your hair cut or colored, tip the stylist at least 10% of the bill.

At massage and reflexology centers, tip at least Rp20,000 for an hour-long foot reflexology. Tips increase incrementally depending on how long and involved your massage goes. Rp50,000 for a 2 hour massage is good.

You do not need to tip taxi drivers.

Useful phrases

In the Indonesian language, "c" is pronounced "ch"

Good morning/afternoon/evening/night - Selamat pagi/siang/sore/malam

How are you - Apa Kabar

Do you speak English? - Bisa bicara bahasa Inggris?

Thank you - Terima kasih

You're welcome - Kembali

Sorry/Excuse me - Maaf

Rest room - Kamar kecil

Go straight - Terus

Turn right/left - Belok kanan/kiri

Stop - Berhenti

Water (Drinking Water)

Bottled water is not sold on campus, so plan to bring a water bottle each day and refill it. Reusable water bottles are available for sale in the Booster Hut and at the Information Centre.

The water on campus from the drinking fountains is safe and clean. There are also water dispensers everywhere.

Elsewhere, in a hotel or restaurant, for example, ask for bottled water ("Aqua dingin" = cold water; "Aqua biasa" = room temperature water; "Tanpa es batu" = no ice; "Air panas" = hot water).

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

Each participant and his/her parent must sign and return this form before traveling or hosting, by so doing they acknowledge that they fully understand and agree to abide by these RULES & GUIDELINES.

PARTICIPANTS

1. Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, inappropriate sexual behavior (05/06), flagrant curfew violations and violations of the "off-limits" areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event. (4/01) When a student commits an infraction relating to alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew / "off limits" areas violations, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- i The student may no longer participate in that convention.
- ii The student will be sent home at his/her parents' expense if it is feasible to do so.
- iii Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
 - Appropriate counseling will be required.
 - The student will be required to spend all free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
 - The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, i.e. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
 - The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
 - Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over to the following school year in cases of late discovery.
 - Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
 - Other Individual School's Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-of-school suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
- iv. For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same convention the following year.
- v. If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all pre-infraction results will stand.
- vi Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.

2. Participants must notify coaches of hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
3. Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed
4. All visiting students must return to the host families' house before curfew-as set by the host school. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
5. All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.
6. No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip Administrator.
7. The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the tournament/convention site.
8. Any problems arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.
9. Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.
10. All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them.

HOST FAMILIES

1. All host families will be provided with complete Tournament/Convention details (schedules, curfews, policies, procedures, emergency phone numbers for coaches and important tournament personnel, etc.).
2. Host parents/guardians will not offer housing unless one of the parents/guardians is present for the duration of the tournament/convention.
3. Hosts are expected to cooperate with Tournament/Convention Director in ensuring student compliance with all IASAS policies relating to participation.
4. Any student who shows reluctance to fully comply with the above rules and regulations shall be reported to the Tournament/Convention Director who will report the matter to the student's coach and Administrator in charge with the expectation that action will be taken.
