VOLLEYBALL

I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

F.I.V.B. (latest edition):

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

- A. Maximum of ten players per team.
- **B.** All teams will receive a 10-minute warm-up period prior to the matches, with a back-up warm-up court available. The following times will apply: 4 minutes on court together, 3 minutes on court, 3 minutes off court. For all matches after the round-robin, the warm-up shall be 20 minutes (6-7-7).

C. Time-out.

In round robin matches each team shall have two timeouts of 30 seconds in each of the games. There will be no technical timeouts in the round robin matches. In subsequent matches there shall be two technical timeouts in the first four games of a match, a length of 30 seconds each. Each team shall have two additional timeouts of 30 seconds in each of the first four games of the match. The fifth game will remain with no technical timeouts and each team will have two 30 second timeouts.

D. Time Between Sets

The length of time between sets will be one minute.

E. Match Play

Round robin matches will compromise the best of 3 sets. The first 2 sets going to 25 points (win by at least 2 points), there will be a cap set at 27 points (26 - 27 wins). If a third set is required, the serve will be determined by a coin toss. Teams will change sides when a team scores 8 points, going to 15 points with no cap.

Matches after the round robin will be played using the standard F.I.V.B. format of 3 out of 5 sets.

III. SUBSTITUTION

There will be a maximum of six substitutions per set. For the other rules on substitution refer to F.I.V.B. Rule Book. (Chapter 3:1 section 8). This change is brought about by an actual change to the F.I.V.B. rules.

IV. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate tournaments.

V. TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

A. Head to Head

(Definition of Head to Head can be found in Section K of Organization and General Regulations Section.)
If tied, go to B.

B. Set Difference (for three or more tied teams):

- 1 For tie-breaking purposes each set is worth one point. Add the total sets won and the total sets lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still a three way tie, go to 2; if a two way tie go back to A.
- 2 Get the set difference of all five matches played of the teams involved in the tie. If still tied, go to C.

C. Point Difference:

- Add the total points scored and the total points scored against each team involved in the tie and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
- 2 Add the total points scored and the total points against, from all five matches played by each of the teams involved in the tie and subtract. To decide the placing, teams will be placed according to the highest positive points gained.

VI. POST SECTION PLAY

- After the round-robin league play, the 4th and 5th place teams and the 3rd and 6th place teams will participate in play-off seeding matches.
- After these matches (matches 16 19) the standings will be reseeded for the play-off games on day 3.
- On the morning of day 3 the 1st and 4th place teams and the 2nd and 3rd place teams will play in the semi-final matches (matches 20 23).
- There will be post section play for the 5th and 6th ranked teams (matches 24 25)
- The losers of matches 20 23 will play a consolation match for 3rd place (matches 26 - 27)

The winners of matches 20 - 23 will play a championship match to decide 1^{st} & 2^{nd} place (matches 28 - 29)

- ✓ Each team will have 14 members. At least one girl and one boy will be represented from each of the six IASAS schools.
- √ 7 players on the field during play.
- ✓ Free substitution is allowed.
- ✓ Games will be 20 minutes running time.
- ✓ We will play with the 10 second stall count.
- ✓ One point is scored for every Frisbee caught over the score line.
- ✓ No one is allowed to touch another member of the other team. If contact is made, the team "hit" gets possession of the Frisbee.
- When a Frisbee is thrown and either touches the ground or goes out of bounds, the other team takes possession at that point on the field.

IASAS CROSS COUNTRY & VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS OCTOBER 24-28, 2007 RULES & GUIDELINES

Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, flagrant curfew violations and violations of the ı. off-limits areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event.

When a student commits an infraction relating to smoking, alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, disrespect, flagrant curfew/off-limits' areas inappropriate sexual behavior, as well as aiding and/or abetting any of the above, the following shall apply:

- The student may no longer participate in that event/convention. The student will be sent home at his/her parents' expense if it is feasible to do so. ìĹ.
- iti. Upon return to school, the following consequences will apply:
- Appropriate counseling will be required.
- The student will be required to spend *all* free periods and breaks (including lunch breaks) in a supervised environment. This consequence will last for 20 school days following the determination of the infraction of the IASAS rule.
- The student must leave campus at the end of the regular school day and may not come to school on weekends/holidays for a period of 40 instructional days. Any exceptions must have administrative approval, i.e. additional study, band concert, curricular trips.
- The student will be excluded from co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
- Consequences related to third sport season infractions may carry over the following school year in cases of late discovery.
- Revocation of IASAS Awards: Students will be ineligible for any awards pertaining to the activity.
- Other Individual School's Consequences: Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks, e.g. out-ofschool suspension, exclusion from all IASAS events for one year.
 - For a second offense, the student will automatically be excluded for one calendar year from all IASAS events, including the same event/convention the following year.
 - If at any time a student is suspended from further competition or involvement in an event, ٧. then the only results affected will be those happening after the infraction, and all preinfraction results will stand.
 - Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.
- Participants must notify coaches or hosts before leaving tournament/convention sites. Exploration of 2. the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.
- Housing assignments may only be changed by the host school's Tournament/Convention Director. 3.
- All visiting students must return to the host families' house before curfew as set by the host school. 4. Telephone calls will be made to each student every night to ensure that all students have returned safely and on time. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house. Note, however, that should an event finishes so late that students have less than one hour to make curfew, the curfew will be extended so that they have at least one hour to make curfew.
- All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host school as required. 5
- No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament/Convention Director without direct 6. communication with the respective coach/sponsor or Trip Administrator.
- Any problems arising during the tournament/convention should be reported immediately to the host 7. school for corrective measures.
- All students must carry their Tournament/Convention Identification Cards with them at all times. 8.
- For all overnight events scheduled by the Activities Office it is expected that parent supervision is 9. provided from 10pm onward each evening.
