





The piece is a deliberately dystopian cautionary tale. Thanks to Laura Schuster for giving me "The Children's Story" by James Clavell, first published in 1963. Partly in reaction to the Communist Witch Hunts of the McCarthy era, Clavell wrote the play to "show how completely vulnerable a child's mind is — any mind for that matter — under controlled circumstances. Why is it so easy to divert thoughts and implant others? What is freedom and why is it so hard to explain?" This was our starting point.

OUR RESECTSABILITY MONOLOGUES FROM UKRAINE ORIGINAL SCRIPT BY VITALI HAVURA

"My impulse, over the past few years, had been to remove myself from my own life, to watch from the periphery and try to see the vectors, the scaffolding, the systems at play" (Anna Wiener, Uncanny Valley).

As Russia rolled tanks, artillery and troops across the sovereign borders of Ukraine on February 24, 2022 most of the world looked on in shock. Viewed on television screens and devices, watching the world's first truly social media war represented a profound shift in the ways in which the world sees war. Yet whilst this access to real-time information was indeed unprecedented and even coalesced much of the world to mobilize support for Ukraine, it also began to feel bizarrely distant. The horrors of war became sanitized, curated, packaged and monetized for clicks. Feelings of detachment and dissociation followed. And yet the war churned on.

All too often in war the stories of those caught in the middle, stories of small heroics, of survival, necessity and grit get lost in the noise. With this piece, created by Ukrainian playwright Vitalii Havura we hope to showcase some of those stories. Stories that remind us of our own familiar humanity, ambitions, fears and determination. With these eight stories from eight real voices from the cities and villages of Ukraine, we hope to break the pattern of those feelings of distance, of disassociation and immerse you, the audience in a new and useful reality. We chose to have you on your feet to blur the distance between these stories and you, to make you active participants, to impart the feeling of theatre have in common is the need for an audience." And we do need you, as we need each other, here and now, to experience, to collectively connect, to dissolve the distance between us.

Throughout this process we were fortunate to have access to and collaborate with ProEnglish Theatre company based out of Kyiv Ukraine. ProEnglish Theatre "Sees its mission in making up-to-date and quality theatre events for multicultural Ukrainian society; developing a friendly, creative and quality English-speaking space for theatre and film actors in Ukraine; in promoting Ukrainian actors and culture initiatives abroad and bringing colleagues from abroad to Ukraine in order to enhance international exchange and communication in the field of performing and allied arts. In February 2022, due to the war, transformed its premises into a bomb shelter for artists and locals."

Koloah: Kyiv based producer and DJ

We were fortunate to gain permission to use original work from Koloah, the wildly talented producer out of Kyiv. All tracks used were from his most recent work, Serenity, created during and after his forced evacuation from Kyiv. As he writes, "On February 24, my life turned upside down into a nightmare, and anxiety became a leading feeling that haunts us wherever we go and no matter what we do. Today it is hard to find support and peace in yourself. All we see around is fear, anger, pain, exhaustion, broken destinies, innocent victims of the war that became the genocide of the Ukranian people.

After the rockets began to fly into the city and the enemy troops almost reached the center, I took my cat, two t-shirts, a jacket, a laptop and left Kyiv. Will I be able to return to my hometown? Will Kyiv be as I remember? Probably only memories..."







Director's Note

INSPIRATION: Cyrano de Bergerac, is a classic French play written by Edmond Rostand in 1897, but set 1600's Paris. Cyrano lives with an enormous nose, a vast vocabulary, and an even bigger chip on his shoulder. These problems prevent him from expressing his love for childhood friend, Roxanne. But when the handsome Christian captures Roxanne's attention, Cyrano is given a chance to reconnect with her, just not in the way he had hoped. The plays enduring appeal is the way it questions the origins of a person's authentic identify. On one hand Cyrano has a rich inner life and moral code, but on the other hand he is hot headed and makes decisions that sabotage his own happiness. So who is the real Cyrano? Ultimately, Rostand concludes any conception of identity is merely a subjective version of reality and that language is just another form of subterfuge. The whole play is written in verse, making a statement in itself about the false ways we represent ourselves though language to the world.

ADAPTED PLOT: Cyrena de Bergerac has a nose so big that even her teachers and family make fun of her. To cope in a world where physical appearances are highly valued, she has become the Master of Self-defense, both verbal and physical, at the Swiss Academy of Arts and Arms (SAAA) Boarding School. Her only visible soft spot is her "secret" crush on childhood friend. Rohan. But Cyrena isn't the only student at SAA struggling to reconcile contradictory elements of identity. And now its Senior year for the Class of 2023, so its time to decide how they will be remembered by their batch mates. Change is definitely afoot and the most dramatic change is revealed on the first day of school. Cyrena de Bergeraci ust got a nose job and everybody's in shock. But was this the change she really needed to make?

CREATIVE PROCESS: The starting point for our adaptation was an examination of the original characters and seeing how they might translate into a modern, teen world. We then did some world building to find an isolated setting where the students would be forced to create their own small world. Which intensified their interest in each other's personal dramas. From there, we used the Project Gutenberg Ebook version of the play to identify key scenes to focus our attention on and used these to inspire a range of devising activities. Gradually, we developed the idea that all students were struggling with the question, to what extend do we have the capacity for change? We then sought ways to explore this whilst still honoring the heart of the original text. Martin Crimp's recent adaption, *Cyrano*, which is based in the world of beat poets, inspired our shift to a world where music was important.

During his training in the U.K., Kenny has worked with choreographers and company's members from around Europe such as Wayne McGregor, Tom Roden, Alexander Whitley, Phillipe Blanchard, Gary Lambert, Alison Curtis-Jones, Lea Anderson, Joseph Toonga, Jeanne Yasko and Fred Ghedrig. With an aptitude in choreography, Kenny has crafted works that have toured Europe namely, 'Within' and 'Rite'.

Kenny produced his debut production in Malaysia: TRIPLE **BILL of Contemporary Dance** Works, featuring two new choreographies - Winged Wolves and Pieces of Three Movements. He is also the commissioned choreographer for the Boh **Cameronian Arts Award. Kenny has** a strong interest in film and has collaborated with Chicago based **NEON 35 MEDIA Company in** choreographing the recent H&M advert. He is also the movement director of the acclaimed musical The Edge, 10th Anniversary production written by Nick Choo, directed by Christopher Ling.

In collaboration with Mobius Dance Company, under the direction of Gianluca Vincentini, KSDC produced a mix bill of contemporary dance works that has received 7 nominations and bagged 2 awards. Establishing himself as a award winning choreographer, Kenny is actively creating works, conducting workshops, and educating budding talents around the region. **Pioneering collaborations with** science, technology and multimedia in Malaysia, KSDC under Kenny's direction has explore many other creative industry such as fashion and was recently featured in Kuala Lumpur Fashion Week 2022.
