Laundry

<u>Badminton</u> - Uniforms should be placed in the basket outside of the Athletics Office at the close of each day. Laundry will be returned to the same area the following morning. No laundry service will be available on Saturday. NOTE: Uniforms only, please. Non-uniform items in the laundry basket will be placed in a Lost & Found box.

Curfew

9:00 pm on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday nights and approximately 10:00 pm on Saturday night. If the tournament runs late, curfew will be extended one hour after the end of the last activity of the evening.

Food

The main cafeteria will be open from 6:00 am until 5:00 pm with Thai and Western food available. The Grind will be open until 5:00pm. Tapica, Paolo Deli, Cafe Kabul, Baan Kimchi, Bendito, Paleo Robbie and Farm Chokchai will be open during the event in the breezeway outside Rajendra Hall.

Hospitality Room

<u>Site One:</u> The ISB Athletics Office on the second floor of the Breezeway will be open for AIC's. It will be stocked daily with coffee, tea, drinks, snacks and fruit courtesy of the ISB Booster Club & ISB Athletics

Epicure will also provide a hot lunch for coaches, administrators and officials each day.

<u>Site Two</u>: The Sports Science room, located in the Sport Complex second floor, will be open for Coaches. It will be stocked daily with coffee, tea, drinks, snacks and fruit courtesy of the ISB Booster Club & ISB Athletics. This will also have breakfast and lunch and dinner for Coaches.

Locker Rooms

The locker rooms and showers are located next to Rajendra Hall. You must provide your own towel, soap and shampoo for showers. Please <u>DO NOT</u> leave any bags or valuables in the locker room.

Warm-Up Area (Badminton)

The warm-up area for badminton is the auxiliary gym adjacent to Rajendra Hall.

Rest Area (Badminton)

The rest area for badminton is the ES gym that is across from Rajendra Hall. While school is in session you will have access to half the gym and then after school/Saturday, you will have the whole gym.

Medical Procedures

- 1. In case of injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competitions, the site director, tournament director, athletic trainer, or school nurse should be notified. The medical staff will be located across from Rajendra Hall. The nurses and medical personnel will be present and on-site for the duration of the competition.
- 2. In the event of a blow, jolt, or whiplash to the head, the athlete will need to be evaluated by the athletic trainer for the possibility of a concussion before being allowed to return to competition.
- 3. If an athlete needs to be taped, the athletic trainer will be available to do so, but please send teams with supplies.
- 4. An injured athlete should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site or tournament director and the athletic trainer or nurse on duty.
- 5. The school nurses are only permitted to issue students non-prescription medication.
- 6. In case of an injury or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call ISB (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either host families or one of the tournament officials at their home as listed in this program.
- 7. In case of an emergency, there will be an ambulance available at the campus on all three days of the competition.

Four-Year IASAS Recognition

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, official IASAS sporting events did not take place from February of 2020 until April of 2022. To earn recognition as a 4-year IASAS participant, it is necessary to have participated in an official IASAS event (in-person or virtual) for 4 consecutive years, and given that this was not possible, IASAS athletic events will not be able to recognize 4-year participants for the next few years. Nonetheless, some IASAS schools were able to have normal seasons and were able to name IASAS teams, even though official events did not take place. With this in mind, IASAS encourages those schools to honor these 4-year IASAS selectees in their own season-ending awards ceremonies. The student-athletes listed below designated with a # are recognized as 4-year IASAS selectees.

Badminton

I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

BWF (latest edition)

B. Meet Rules:

- 1. Each school fields one boys' team and one girls' team.
- 2. On each team 3 members will play singles and 4 will play doubles.
- 3. Players must be ranked according to ability for singles and doubles #1, #2 and #3. Number #1 ranking being the top player. Line-ups will be given to the Site Director at the start of each match, and cannot be changed during the match.
- 4. The #1 ranked players from each school will play each other, the #2 ranked players will play each other, and the #3 ranked players will play each other, in the round robin. Once a player or doubles team has been assigned a ranking, he/she cannot change ranking during the tournament.
- 5. Each team match will consist of 3 singles and 2 doubles, with the winning team decided by the best of 5 matches. All matches must be played.
- 6. a. The 8th player substitute will play Alternate (exhibition) matches. The 8th player may substitute into the tournament at any position if a player is unable to participate. No player can substitute during a match. No players can switch ranking once the tournament has started.
 - b. The 8th player will be eligible to play at any position as a "free switch" during the tournament. At such a switch the original player may only return to their original position. This free switch may occur as many as 3 times during the tournament. The alternate may switch/substitute with any position player before the start of any match. Example: 1st doubles Player A has a stomach ache, the coach sits him/her and sends the alternate to play in his/her place. Player A recovers the next morning and is ready to play, so the coach reinserts Player A into first doubles. This is considered a second free switch, thus the alternate player can switch one more time. This switch would be the third one and the alternate player would then have to complete the tournament in that position.
- 7. The tournament will be run on a round-robin format. In the round robin matches the first two games will be played first to 21 points (capped, no need to win by two points). The third game will also be to 21 points but must be won by two points with a cap of 30. The round-robin league standing of the teams will be determined by their win-loss record with all teams advancing to a post section play, see VIII.POST SECTION PLAY. In case of a tie following round-robin play, rules under IX.TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDING will apply. The post section matches will be played as usual to 21 points (win by two points, cap of 30).
- 8. There will be a ten-minute warm-up before each match. To clarify, before the team matches at 8:00 AM, the teams are given five minutes across half of the courts on which they will be playing to warm-up with teammates from 7:50-7:55. Individual players will then report to the scorers' table to pick up their scorecards. They will then have five more minutes on the court to warm-up against their opponent from 7:55-8:00. Before the individual matches, players will have five minutes of shared warm-up time with their opponent on the court on which they will be playing.
- 9. Players will call their own lines and keep score. A player can request an official to assist with calling the lines if he/she believes that there is a need. Players make that request to their coach who will then confer with the Site Director. The official charged with overseeing the match will overturn or confirm a call if disputed/challenged by the opponent and if the official clearly saw the disputed shuttle.
- 10. Players must report to the main desk before the start of their match and immediately after the match to report the score.
- 11. A player reporting more than fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled match time will be declared a walk over.
- 12. Coaches are not allowed to coach or provide any instruction other than encouragement to the athletes inbetween points in any language. Coaches will be allowed to consult with their players for 60 seconds during each game when the leading scorer reaches 11 points, and between sets. Coaches will not be allowed within the vicinity of or on the courts for consultation unless there is no outside access. The location of the coaches' chairs (2 maximum) will be determined by the limits of the facility and the decision of the site director.
- 13. Order of play will be as follows:
 - a. #3 Singles
 - b. #2 Doubles
 - c. Alternates
 - d. #2 Singles
 - e. #1 Doubles
 - f. #1 Singles

Please note that whenever possible matches a, b and c should be played concurrently on three courts followed by matches d, e and f.

- 14. In the event of an injury during a match, only one 5-minute injury time for treatment will be allowed for the duration of that match to determine if the player can continue. The Site Director should monitor the situation.
- 15. The right to towel-off and/or drink during a match can only be initiated by the serving team.
- 16. When illegal serves are not contested by the opposing player, the coach of the opposing player is allowed to summon the official to the court for review. The official will inform the player of serving error(s) for player correction. This would be an exception to BWF rules and become an IASAS rule.

II. ROSTERS

Rosters (eight boys and eight girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament. The roster form should include the following information:

- A. Name;
- **B.**Grade:
- C. Passport nationality;
- **D.**Birth date;
- **E.** Housing preference.
- **F.** Playing position:

Coaches will declare final seeds on Monday of tournament week by 3pm so that the seeds (positions) can be put into the tournament program/webpage. Coaches cannot change seeds after this time and substitutions can only be made due to injure/visa/emergency issues. Any changes must be advised to the host AD or tournament director upon arrival. Changes at the pre-tournament meeting are not allowed.

III. FACILITIES

- 1. A minimum of 6 courts are required.
- 2. Shuttle cocks will be provided by the host.

IV. UNIFORMS

Each member of the team will wear the same uniform for the entire match. No tank tops are allowed and the uniform must be of school colors.

V. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate the meet.

VI. PROTESTS

All protests are to go through the Tournament Director or to the Convention Director. (see section 1.8 XVII).

VII. SCORING

It is recommended that when possible, flip scoreboards be used at each court.

VIII. POST SECTION PLAY

- After the round-robin league play, the 4th and 5th place teams and the 3rd and 6th place teams will participate in Play-Off seeding matches.
- After these matches (matches 31-34, see section XIV) the standings will be reseeded for the Semi-Final matches on day 3.
- On the morning of day 3 the 1st and 4th place teams and the 2nd and 3rd place teams will play in the Semi-Final matches (matches 35-38)
- There will be a 5th Place Consolation Match for the 5th and 6th ranked teams (matches 39 & 40)
- The losers of matches 35-38 will play Bronze Medal matches for 3rd place (matches 41 & 42)
- The winners of matches 35-38 will play Championship Matches to decide 1st & 2nd place (matches 43 & 44)
- In the Play-Off rounds for both boys and girls the highest seed will play in the premier facility- each gender 4&5, 3&6 will play at the same time. The order to reflect the profiled gender.

IX. TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

A. Head to Head

(Definition of Head to Head can be found in Section L of Convention Organization.) If after L.3 teams are still tied, go to B.

B. Match difference (for three or more tied teams):

- 1. Add the total matches won and the total matches lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
- 2. Get the match difference of all the matches played of the teams involved in the tie. If still tied, go to C.

C. Set Difference:

Add the total games won and the total games lost of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to D.

D. Point Difference:

- 1. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against of each team involved against each of the other tied teams and subtract. Then rank the teams according to their positive points scored. If still tied, go to 2.
- 2. Add the total points scored and the total points scored against of all the matches played by each of the teams involved in the tie and subtract. To decide the placing, teams will be placed according to the highest positive points gained.

X. AWARDS

A. Championship Team:

- 1 IASAS Traveling Plaque
- 2 IASAS Championship Plaque
- 3 Team Members-Champion Chevrons (10)
- 4 Team Members Gold Medals (10)

B. Runner-up:

- 1 Team Members-Runner-up Chevrons (10)
- 2 Team Members Silver Medals (10)

C. Third Place:

Team Members - Bronze Medals (10)

D. All-Tournament:

All-tournament chevrons for both boys & girls shall be given to the following:

- Best #1 Singles (1 boy & 1 girl)
- Best #2 Singles (1 boy & 1 girl)
- Best #3 Singles(1 boy & 1 girl)
- Best #1 Doubles pair (2 boys & 2 girls)
- Best #2 Doubles pair (2 boys & 2 girls)
- Best Alternate Singles (1 boy & 1 girl)

The All-tournament award is given to the players with the best record at their respective position. To qualify for the all-tournament award, players must have played in all five matches in the round robin section.

The tie breaker for All-Tournament players should be the same as the tie breaker for league standings as noted 9.2 IX.

XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Scheduling of Matches:

Matches between schools should be at least 1½ hours apart.

B. Umpires:

Provide an umpire for each venue to facilitate solving difficulties in on court decision making.

C. Scorers:

Provide one unofficial scorer per court to allow spectators to follow the game.

XII. MATCH SCHEDULE

Please see the badminton match schedule excel document that is included in the Forms section

Golf

I. RULES

The tournament shall follow the rules of golf for stroke play and match play as determined by the United States Golf Association and the Royal and Ancient Rules of Golf with the exception of XI. Protests, which takes precedence.

II. RULE EXCEPTIONS

- **A.** Always hit a provisional ball if in doubt as to whether the original ball is out of bounds.
- **B.** In the event of a controversial lie, etc., if a marshal is not available to make a ruling, the player should hit a 2nd ball and score both. The committee can then later decide when the player finishes the round which of the two balls was played within the rules of golf.
- C. Shotgun start whenever possible.
- **D.** The committee will determine <u>before the start of the tournament</u> whether boys go off of blue or white tees, and whether girls go off red or white tees.
- **E.** In the event of B above and or any other rule infraction, dispute or score discrepancy, these must be rectified with a course marshal immediately or, if course marshal is not available, must be resolved prior to signing and submission of cards at the conclusion of the round.
- **F.** With regards to balls hit out of bounds, players can opt to use the PGA rule (OB ball can be dropped two club lengths from the edge of the fairway with a two stroke penalty) or any local club rule that may be in effect.

III. ROSTERS

Rosters (up to 6 boys and 6 girls) must be submitted two weeks prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- Name
- Grade
- Passport nationality
- Birth date
- Ranking (1 6) for establishing foursomes
- Housing preferences/needs
- Allergies/Medical Issues

IV. SUBSTITUTIONS

There are no substitutes or alternates. All players are expected to play all three days. In the event of a player being unable to play due to sickness or injury, the team must take the best scores from a reduced squad on days 1 and 2, and forfeit one match play match on day 3 (see X. Tournament Scoring). If a player is unable to complete a round, the seeding of that player coming into the round will be used to determine their seed for the next day. The remainder of the players will be seeded based upon their scores/results of the day's round.

V. FACILITIES

Par 72 golf course is advisable, although par 70 or 71 is acceptable depending on availability of courses in the host school's area.

VI. UNIFORMS

Each team member will wear the team's golf shirt(s) during play throughout the event.

VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

Students bring their own clubs, balls, and all equipment. Preference is to leave bags at venue overnight between rounds if possible. Scores will be posted by the host school near the clubhouse. Range finders/GPS watches may be used, but cell phones cannot be used during play.

VIII. OFFICIALS

The host school will supply a tournament director who will oversee the competition and settle any discrepancies. Whenever possible, the tournament director will consult with a committee consisting of the athletic director of the host school, the head coach of each team, and a home course pro or official if available for any rule interpretations, decisions on scoring, or changes in format due to weather or other conditions. Ultimate responsibility for any decision on breach/discrepancy/protest shall be made by the tournament director after consultation with the committee.

The club where the championship is being contested works with the tournament director to ensure that play is not too slow. Coaches are to marshal play on individual holes and make judgment calls on questionable rulings to the best of their ability, subject to review by the committee/tournament director. Questionable rulings must be dealt with before cards are submitted and signed.

IX. TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

Day 1 foursomes will be arranged according to the matrix below using the rankings as submitted prior to the tournament and the letter assignments indicated in the Schedule Maker Pro. Following day 1, players are re-seeded within their own teams based on their gross scores from that round. Team allocations are also changed based on the team's day 1 standings: e.g. the 1st ranked team becomes A, the 2nd ranked team becomes B, etc. Foursomes are then made using the same matrix.

Group 1: A1 B1 C1 D1

Group 2: E1 F1 B2 C2

Group 3: D2 E2 F2 A2

Group 4: C3 D3 E3 F3

Group 5: A3 B3 D4 E4

Group 6: F4 A4 B4 C4

Group 7: E5 F5 A5 B5

Group 8: C5 D5 F6 A6

Group 9: B6 C6 D6 E6

Day 3 match play foursomes will be organized with the 5th/6th golfers going off together, then the 3rd/4th golfers, and finally the 1st/2nd golfers.

At the start of every day there must be a warm-up time of 30 minutes. Additionally, there also must be a full-group meeting at the golf course on day 1 and day 3 prior to commencing play.

Coaches should be allowed to coach. For all three days Green-to-Tee is the allowed coaching venue for technical comments.

X. TOURNAMENT SCORING

<u>First two days</u>: gross score of top four players <u>each day</u> is the team aggregate score. Different players can contribute each day. Gross scores after two days determine the team rankings for the day three match play.

A maximum number of ten strokes is allowed on each hole. A tenth shot in the hole should be marked with the number "10." In the event that a player is not in the hole after their tenth shot, they should then pick up their ball and mark "10X" on their scorecard. In the case of a tie between teams to determine seeding, the tie-breaking procedure is as follow:

- (1) If two or more teams are tied, the team with the fewest number of 10X's on their scorecards amongst the top four golfers for the round(s) in question will be seeded higher.
- (2) If teams are still tied after (1), then go to the scores of the fifth-ranked golfers. If the scores of the number five golfers still result in a tie, then the number of 10X's on those fifth ranked golfers will be counted and the team with the fewer 10X's will be seeded higher.
- (3) If still tied after (2), then proceed to the sixth ranked golfers, and then if necessary, to the day 1 scores of the fifth and sixth ranked players in that order.

<u>Day 3</u>: Low teams 1 & 2 play for gold, teams 3 & 4 play for bronze, teams 5 & 6 play for placing only. Day three is match play with lowest gross scoring players from each team for the first two days in match play competition; second lowest playing each other, etc. 1 point for match play win; one-half point for a draw; 0 for a loss. All six matches count. Winner of the match is the team with most points on day 3. In case of a tie, the team with the lower ranking from days 1 & 2 will be declared the winner. Note: individual medals are based on low gross scoring for days 1 & 2 only (see XII. Awards below).

XI. PROTESTS

For disputed play or scoring, a decision is made with or without marshal's aid depending on availability of marshal (see II. Rule Exceptions); protests are settled at the end of the round by the committee <u>before</u> scores are made official. The tournament director will ensure a school AIC or adult assistant will ask each group as they collate their scorecards (before signing) at the end of each days play if there are any concerns surrounding rules or scoring that happened during the round. Once scorecards are signed and submitted no protest or requests for rule interpretation(s) or scoring adjustments will be entertained.

XII. AWARDS

The same awards are given to both Boys and Girls teams.

 - 1. IASAS Traveling Plaque
 - 2. IASAS Championship Plaque
 - 3. Team Members-Champion Chevrons (8)
 - 4. Gold Medal to each competitor (8)

B. Runner-Up Team

- 1. Team Members-Runner-Up Chevrons (8)
- 2. Silver medal to each competitor (8)

C. Third Place Team

- 1. Bronze medal to each competitor (8)
- **D.** We recognize IASAS records for low scores achieved either <u>total strokes</u> for first two days or in the case of playing a course with less than par 72, strokes vs. par.
- **E.** Teams are not eligible to win team awards if they have an incomplete team i.e. 3 boys or 3 girls (FEWER THAN 4 GOLFERS) because they can't get an aggregate total for the first two days. Teams with 4 or 5 golfers must forfeit matches on day three for each missing golfer (if there are only 4 golfers on a team, match play matches 5 and 6 must be forfeited).
- **F.** Best Individual Golfers: Top three finishers in boys and girls <u>for stroke play days 1 and 2</u> receive medals; first through sixth place finishers for those first two days of play receive all tournament chevrons.

NOTE: When ties occur in an individual medal event, the medal award for a position will be made based on the number of places above the awardee. For example, if two competitors tie for first place, the next award would be the third place award. If two competitors tie for second place, the next award will be for fourth place. All awards are to be distributed at the Closing Ceremony.

I.A.S.A.S RULES & GUIDELINES

Each participant and his/her parent must sign and return this form before traveling or hosting, by so doing they acknowledge that they fully understand and agree to abide by these RULES & GUIDELINES.

PARTICIPANTS:

When a student commits a serious infraction including, but not limited to, drug use (including alcohol, tobacco / e-cigarette or other mood altering substances), deceit, theft, flagrant curfew violations, violations of the "off limits" areas, as well as aiding and abetting any of the above, the following will apply:

- The student may no longer participate in that IASAS exchange, convention or tournament. They will not be recognized during the IASAS awards ceremony.
- 2. The student will be sent home at parents' expense if it is feasible to do so.
- Students involved in egregious violations, as determined by the principals of the impacted IASAS schools, will be suspended out-of-school for two days. Students will be administratively excused until those IASAS principals reach consensus on how to move forward.
- Character-related awards such as Spirit of IASAS will be revoked.
- Cheating at events may result in removal of medals and revocation of records after formal review by IASAS Athletics and/or Activities Directors.
- The student will be excluded from IASAS related co-curricular activities for a period of 40 school days following the determination of the infraction. The student will be excluded from any IASAS season/activity that begins within this 40-day period.
- 7. Consequences related to third season infractions will carry over to the following school year...
- For a second offense, the student will be excluded for one calendar year from IASAS events including the same exchange, convention or tournament the following year.
- 9. Consequences will be carried over if the student transfers to another IASAS school.

Other Individual School's Consequences:

Depending on the severity and specifics of the infraction and the student's past behavior, individual IASAS schools may levy other consequences as per their school policy/handbooks. This may include further exclusion from all IASAS events.

HOST FAMILIES

- All host families will be provided with complete Tournament/Convention details (schedules, curfews, policies, procedures, emergency phone numbers for coaches or AIC and important tournament personnel, etc.).
- All IASAS participants will be required to agree to host for an IASAS event or identify a substitute who will host on their behalf. It is required that a host parent or student pick up students they are housing when the visiting teams first arrive at the host school.
- Hosting parents need to acknowledge (physical or digital signature or email receipt) that they know and understand the IASAS rules for housing and their specific responsibilities as a host. If host families have any concerns regarding the behavior of the hosted students, medical concerns or suspect a curfew violation, they should contact the tournament director immediately.
- Information regarding any host student medical concerns will be shared with host families by the tournament director. This
 information should remain confidential.
- 5. Curfew Checks: Students are expected to be at home by curfew each evening and stay in the home until the following morning. Coaches/AICs will conduct curfew checks by suitable methods, which can include phone/messaging apps, etc. It should be clear to the host family that these checks are being made, either by speaking directly to the host parents or including the host parent in the photo challenge.

IASAS, the Interscholastic Association of Southeast Asia Schools, began in the fall of 1982. The seeds of the organization, however, were planted long before that with sports competitions that were arranged between many of the international schools in the Southeast Asia region.

For example, Singapore American School (SAS) and International School Bangkok (ISB) participated in an annual, multi-sport event called the *Singapore-Bangkok Games*, which started in the spring of 1962. If you look into the history of athletics at your home school, you are sure to find instances when your school competed against another IASAS school prior to 1982.

In 1980, the International School of Kuala Lumpur (ISKL) asked to participate in this event, creating what then became known as the *Triangular Games*. It was around this time that the idea of forming an international school athletic conference began to develop.

It was probably at an EARCOS Conference in Hong Kong during the '81-'82 school year that the idea of forming IASAS became a reality. Primarily spear-headed by the Heads of School from ISKL, Gail Schoppert, SAS, Mel Kuhbander, and JIS, Everett Gould, there was a desire to create an international athletics conference in the region.

This organization was to be modeled after similar conferences that were active in South Asia, SAISA, which was familiar to some of these gentlemen, as well as the ISST Conference in Europe.

It wasn't too long after that that the Athletic Directors and other individuals from schools in the region met at the old Singapore American School campus on Kings Road tasked with creating the organization.

Participating in this meeting were Al Daniel and Dave Hagan from ISKL, K.S. Kasinathan and Dick Lewis from SAS, Derryl Franz from ISB, along with other participants from ISS.

The result, as we now know, was IASAS, which formally started in October of 1982 with four schools: JIS, SAS, ISKL and ISB. International School Manila (ISM) joined the conference the very next year, while Taipei American School (TAS) joined the group in 1986, creating the six-school conference that has flourished ever since. At the urging of SAS' Kuhbander and Lewis, a cultural component, the Cultural Convention, was also instituted that very first school year.

The conventions that first school year included soccer & volleyball (first tournament in Nov. of 1982 at ISKL),

basketball & swimming (second event in Feb. of 1983 at SAS), softball & track and field (third IASAS March 1983 at JIS), as well as a cultural convention (first event in Apr 1983 at ISB).

Over the years, various activities were added to the agenda, and today the wide-ranging IASAS activities include:

- 1st Season: Cross-Country, Soccer, Volleyball
- Model United Nations and Cultural Convention Art/Film
- 2nd Season: Basketball, Rugby/Touch, Swimming, Tennis
- Math Contest & Chess [virtual, non-travel activities]
- Cultural Convention: Drama-Dance-Technology, Forensics-Debate, and Music
- 3rd Season: Badminton, Baseball/Softball, Track & Field, Golf

For everyone involved, students, coaches, administrators, parents and community members alike, IASAS is one of the most memorable times of any school year.

Now more than 40 years old and widely recognized as one of the premier international school activities and athletics conferences in the world, we can only thank those who came before and helped to create such a remarkable organization.

While in-person events were curtailed these past few school years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are certain that IASAS will continue to prosper for many more decades to come. With IASAS Volleyball/Cross Country in Bangkok and IASAS Soccer in Kuala Lumpur, we are excited that we can again begin to properly celebrate our great organization.
