IASAS Soccer Rules

I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

F.I.F.A. (latest edition): http://www.fifa.com/en/regulations/regulation /0.1584.3.00.html

B. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school.

C. There is no official ball for IASAS Soccer. (10/03)

D. Yellow Card:

A yellow card is the final warning for a player. Any further infringement by the player will be indicated by a "red card". Any player who is shown two yellow cards during the tournament will automatically be suspended for the next game and will be ineligible for all-tournament selection. (5/94)

E. Red Card:

- Any player penalized with a "red card" will be evicted for that game and also miss the next game and will be ineligible for all tournament selection. No substitutes will be allowed for penalized players.
- If a goalkeeper is shown a red card, a substitute from the bench may come in for the goalkeeper. A field player must then come off, leaving the team to play with 10 players. (10/00)

NOTE: The site directors must keep a tally of yellow/red cards received and will inform coaches when a player becomes ineligible. (5/99)

F. Teams must play all rounds of the Round Robin even if the last game is a repeat of the Championship Game. Forfeits are not allowed. (10/00)

II. RULE EXCEPTION

A. Playing Time:

35 minute halves, 10 minute half times, (5/98), plus added time for stoppages of play at the referees' discretion, but without adding extra time for substitutions. (10/01)

B. Substitution:

See "Substitution" below

III. ROSTERS

Rosters (up to 16 boys and 16 girls) must be submitted two week prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- A. Name:

- E. Uniform number (both light and dark); and
- F. Housing preferences

IV. ENTRIES

Not Applicable.

V. SUBSTITUTION

There will be unlimited substitution subject to the following, which replaces the FIFA substitution rule:

- A. 1. The team in possession may substitute on throw-ins and goal kicks only. The team not in possession may substitute only if their players have already been "checked in" by officials and only after the team in possession makes a substitution. (5/94)
 - 2. Both teams may substitute after a goal has been scored. (5/99)
 - 3. If the referee invites, or asks that, a player be removed from the field due to injury, both teams are allowed to make a substitution at that time. (10/00)

- B. A designated person, other than the Site Director, will coordinate and monitor the substitutions to ensure that all substitutions are made in the approved manner.
- Coaches may use their entire bench in every match.
- D. The fourth official monitoring substitutions must use a loud noisemaking device, other than a whistle, to attract the attention of the referee for substitutions. (10/00)

VI. FACILITIES

Two soccer pitches are required, one of which must be on the high school campus with some spectator seating. The other pitch should either be on campus or be very near the high school.

VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

VIII. UNIFORMS

- A. Each player must wear protective shin guards
- B. Each player must have both a white and dark colored jersey with numbers on both the front and back.

IX. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate tournaments.

X.TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

A. Head to Head

Definition of Head to Head as specified in section K of the convention organization. If tied, go to B. (10/01)

B. Goal Difference

Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in all matches exclusively involving the tied teams. The team with the highest score is the winner. If tied, go to C. (10/01)

C. Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in all matches exclusively involving the tied teams and the highest placed team in the league standings not involved in the tie. (10/01)

D. Shoot-out

See section XII.

XI. TIE BREAKER FORCHAMPIONSHIP GAME-OVERTIME

- A. Following a five-minute break after regulation play, the respective captains will report to midfield where the referee will perform the coin toss.
- B. A 7-A-Side (no off-sides called) "sudden death" period will be played. The first team to score is declared the winner. If no team has scored after 7 minutes the teams will exchange field positions. If no team has scored after further 7 minutes, teams will go to the shootout procedure (4 /02)

XII. TIE BREAKER FOR CHAMPIONSHIP GAME-SHOOT-OUT

- A. Each team will be represented by five shooters from 11 designated players, at the end of "sudden death" overtime
- B. All shooters will report to the referee
- C. The referee will record the shooting order
- D. The winner of the shoot-out is based on the most goals scored by either team in five attempts
- E. If a tie exists at this point, a sudden death shoot-out will take place

XIII. PROTEST

A. First instance, any protest or appeal will be handled by the rulebook of the particular activity concerned. This would occur after an appeal to the official.

Except where it may be noted specifically in the IASAS guidelines, only official coaches and/or administrators may file a protest at any IASAS event. (5/99)

B. If "A" is not possible or is subject to further appeal, a formal written appeal should be made to the Head Official of activity. This should be made within two hours and should be made through the site director. The Head Official of the activity i.e. Section Director (e.g. Head Basketball Official, Forensics Tournament Manager, Head Track and Field Official, etc.) must then make a decision.

The Section Director should make this decision with or without consultation of the coaches involved in that area. The Section Director is free to consult anyone he/she sees fit in helping to make a decision.

A decision should then be communicated to all parties concerned, with copies and a brief report going to the Tournament/Convention Director.

C. If "B" is appealed, the appeals procedure will continue as follows:

Further appeal can only occur with the approval of the Section Director. The appeal shall be in writing and shall be made within two hours of the placing of the decision being appealed. The appeal should be handed to the Section Director who in turn will add his own report and further comments and present the entire matter to the Convention Director.

If the Convention Director cannot or feels he/she cannot solve the situation, he/she should then call a meeting of the Activities Directors/Administrators present at the convention. (NOTE: This meeting is for input and advice only. It is not a voting forum)

At this time, the Convention Director should get all the information he/she needs. This includes a formal meeting if necessary.

The Convention Director will then make the final decision which will be communicated in writing to all school representatives at the convention.

Offside Position

Offence

It is not an offence in itself to be in an offside position. A player is in an offside position if:

• he is nearer to his opponents' goal line than both the ball and the second last opponent.

A player is not in an offside position if:

- he is not in his own half of the field of play; or
- he is level with the second last opponent; or
- he is level with the last two opponents.

No Offence

A player in an offside position is only penalized if, at the | No Offence moment the ball touches or is played by one of his team. he is, in the opinion of the referee, involved in active play by:

- · interfering with play; or
- interfering with an opponent; or
- gaining an advantage by being in that position.

There is no offside offence if a player receives the ball directly from:

- · a goal kick; or
- · a throw-in; or

a corner kick.

Infringements/Sanctions

For any offside offence, the referee awards an indirect free kick to the opposing team to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

Fouls and misconduct are penalized as follows:

Direct Free Kick

A direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a player commits;

any of the following six offences in a manner considered | any of the following four offences: by the referee to be careless, reckless or using excessive force:

- kicks or attempts to kick an opponent;
- trips or attempts to trip an opponent;
- jumps at an opponent;
- charges an opponent;
- strikes or attempts to strike an opponent;
- pushes an opponent.

- tackles an opponent to gain possession of the ball, making contact with the opponent before touching the ball:
- · holds an opponent;
- · spits at an opponent;
- handles the ball deliberately (except for the goalkeeper within his own penalty area).

A direct free kick is taken from where the offence occurred.

A direct free kick is taken from where the offence occurred.

Penalty Kick

A penalty kick is awarded if any of the above ten offences is committed by a player inside his own penalty area, irrespective of the position of the ball, provided it is in play.

Indirect Free Kick

An indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a goalkeeper, inside his own penalty area, commits any of the following four offences: ..

- takes more than six seconds while controlling the . ball with his hands before releasing it from his possession;
- touches the ball again with his hands after it has been released from his possession and has not touched any other player;

An indirect free kick is also awarded to the opposing team if a player, in the opinion of the referee:

- plays in a dangerous matter;
- · impedes the progress of an opponent;
- · prevents the goalkeeper from releasing the ball from his hands:
- commits any other offence, not previously mentioned in Law 12, for which play is stopped to caution or dismiss a player.

- touches the ball with his hands after it has been deliberately kicked to him by a team-mate;
- touches the ball with his hands after he has received it directly from a throw-in taken by a team-mate.

The indirect free kick is taken from where the offence occurred.

Disciplinary Sanctions Cautionable Offences

A player is cautioned and shown the yellow card if he commits any of the following seven offences:

- 1. is guilty of unsporting behaviour;
- 2. shows dissent by word or action:
- 3. persistently infringes the Laws of the Game;
- 4. delays the restart of play;
- 5. fails to respect the required distance when play is restarted with a corner kick or free kick:
- 6. enters or re-enters the field of play without the referee's permission;
- 7. deliberately leaves the field of play without the referee's permission.

Sending-Off Offences

A player is sent off and shown the red card if he commits any of the following seven offences:

- 1. is guilty of serious foul play;
- 2. is guilty of violent conduct:
- 3. spits at an opponent or any other person;
- 4. denies the opposing team a goal or an obvious goalscoring opportunity by deliberately handling the ball (this does not apply to a goalkeeper within his own penalty area):
- 5. denies an obvious goalscoring opportunity to an opponent moving towards the player's goal by an offence punishable by a free kick or a penalty kick;
- 6. uses offensive or insulting or abusive language and/or gestures:
- 7. receives a second caution in the same match.

Types of Free Kicks

Free kicks are either direct or indirect, the ball must be stationary when the kick is taken and the kicker does not touch the ball a second time until it has touched another player.

The Direct Free Kick

- If a direct free kick is kicked directly into the opponents' goal, a goal is awarded.
- If a direct free kick is kicked directly into the team's own goal, a corner kick is awarded to the opposing team.

The Indirect Free Kick

The referee indicates an indirect free kick by raising his arm above his head. He maintains his arm in that

position until the kick has been taken and the ball has touched another player or goes out of play. Ball Enters the Goal

A goal can be scored only if the ball subsequently touches another player before it enters the goal.

- If an indirect free kick is kicked directly into the opponents' goal, a goal kick is awarded.
- If an indirect free kick is kicked directly into the team's own goal, a corner kick is awarded to the opposing team.

Position of Free Kick

Free Kick Inside the Penalty Area

Direct or indirect free kick to the defending team:

- All opponents are at least 9.15 m (10 vds) from the ball.
- All opponents remain outside the penalty area until the ball is in play.
- The ball is in play when it is kicked directly beyond the penalty area.
- A free kick awarded in the goal area is taken from any point inside that area

Free Kick Outside the Penalty Area

- All opponents are at least 9.15 m (10 yds) from the ball until it is in play.
- The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves.
- The free kick is taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

Indirect Free Kick to the Attacking Team:

- All opponents are at least 9.15 m (10 yds) from the ball until it is in play, unless they are on their own goal line
- The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves.
- An indirect free kick awarded inside the goal area is taken from that part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal line, at the point nearest to where the infringement occurred.

Infringements/Sanctions

- If, when a free kick is taken, an opponent is closer to the ball than the required distance the kick is retaken.
- If, when a free kick is taken by the defending team from inside its own penalty area, the ball is not kicked directly into play: the kick is retaken.

Free Kick Taken by a Player Other than the Goalkeeper If, after the ball is in play, the kicker touches the ball a second time (except with his hands) before it has touched another player:

 an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team, the kick to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

If, after the ball is in play, the kicker deliberately handles the ball before it has touched another player:

- a direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team, the kick to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred; *(See page 3)
- a penalty kick is awarded if the infringement occurred inside the kicker's penalty area.

Free Kick Taken by the Goalkeener

If after the ball is in play, the goalkeeper touches the ball a second time (except with his hands), before it has touched another player:

• an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team, the kick to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

If, after the ball is in play, the goalkeeper deliberately handles the ball before it has touched another player:

- a direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team if the infringement occurred outside the goalkeeper's penalty area, the kick to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred; * (See page 3)
- an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team if the infringement occurred inside the goalkeeper's penalty area, the kick to be taken from the place where the infringement occurred.

Decisions of the International F.A. Board

- The goalkeeper is considered to be in control of the ball by touching it with any part of his hand or arms. Possession of the ball includes the goalkeeper deliberately parrying the ball, but does not include the circumstances where, in the opinion of the referee, the ball rebounds accidentally from the goalkeeper, for example after he has made a save.
- A player may pass the ball to his own goalkeeper using his head or chest or knee, etc. If, however, in the opinion of the referee, a player uses a deliberate trick while the ball is in play in order to circumvent the Law, the player is guilty of unsporting behaviour. He is cautioned, shown the yellow card and an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team from the place where the infringement occurred.
- A player using a deliberate trick to circumvent the Law while he is taking a free kick is cautioned for unsporting behaviour and shown the yellow card. The free kick is retaken. In such circumstances, it is irrelevant whether the goalkeeper subsequently touches the ball with his hands or not. The offence is committed by the player in attempting to circumvent both the letter and the spirit of Law 12.
- · A tackle from behind, which endangers the safety of an opponent, must be sanctioned as serious foul play.
- Any simulating action anywhere on the field, which is intended to deceive the referee, must be sanctioned as unsporting behaviour.
- A player who removes his jersey when celebrating a goal must be cautioned for unsporting behaviour.

VISITORS' GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT JAKARTA

♦ AIRPORT & LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

You should be at the airport 2 hours before departure to assure adequate time for processing immigration and check-in formalities. You should allow an hour for travel time from the J.I.S. to the airport if you are leaving on a weekday or approximately 40 minutes if you are traveling on Sunday.

IMPORTANT:

- ♦ Make absolutely sure that you have your white immigration arrival card with you at the airport when you leave.
- ♦ Airport Tax when departing from Jakarta is Rp. 100,000 if you are leaving on an international flight. This fee must be paid in local currency when you check in at the airport.

Taxis are a convenient way to travel around Jakarta. The "Bluebird" taxi company is largely thought to be the best and most reliable. Regular taxis have meters with a starting price of Rp. 2,500. Make sure the taxi driver starts the meter when you state your destination, and if he insists on fixing a price take a different taxi if you have the option to do so.

Time: Jakarta is: GMT +7, 1 hour behind Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Taipei and the same as Bangkok

♦ CURRENCY

The Indonesian unit of currency is the rupiah (pronounced ru-pee-ah). The current exchange rate fluctuates around Rp. 9300= US\$ 1. Rupiah bank notes come in the following denominations:

Rp. 50,000	US\$ 5.50
Rp. 20,000	US\$ 2.30
Rp. 5,000	US\$.55
RP. 1,000	US\$.11

Watch Out!! Tourists often mistake a 1,000 for a 100,000.

♦ CHANGING MONEY

Currency and travelers checks can be exchanged at the school bank Monday and Tuesday, at the airport, at banks and at authorized moneychangers. Normal banking hours are approximately 8:30 AM to 2:30 PM from Monday to Friday, and 8:30 AM to 1:00 PM on Saturdays. Major credit cards are accepted at many (but not all) shops. However, beware – some outlets charge a surcharge.

→ PERSONAL SAFETY

Generally, Jakarta is a fairly safe place. However, as in most large cities, it is advisable to be alert and take all usual precautions against theft of personal items. Do not wear "flashy" jewelry when out shopping, or leave your bag open, or have your wallet/purse visible. Do not carry your airline ticket, passport, or more money than is necessary around with you. Beware of the traffic! Drivers here are not always as careful as they might be.

♦ HEALTH

Non-infectious diarrhea may result from eating hot, unfamiliar spicy dishes. Patent medicines are widely available in local pharmacies (called "apotiks"). A popular medicine here to fight off diarrhea is "Norit" (charcoal tablets). They are easily available locally.

♦ WATER

It is NOT safe to drink tap water. When in the hotel or houses drink the bottled water and drink only sealed bottled water outside. All tap water on J.I.S. campus is safe to drink.

♦ DRESS CODE

Casual dress is the norm for visiting most places, although if visiting government offices, women should wear skirts, not shorts or trousers. Shorts are acceptable attire for walking around the city or shopping.

♦ TOUTS

If you walk outside the school campus, you will discover that the local people are keen to exchange greetings with you, but also to tempt you to buy their wares/take their local taxis/try the food they are selling, etc.,etc. If you are not interested, just say a firm "no, thank you" and carry on walking. You could try the Indonesian version: "Tidak, terima kasih", pronounced "Tee-da, ter-ee-ma kassee". A customary question from Indonesians will be "Where are you going?" to which you could reply "Jalan-jalan" (walking).
