

## **MEDICAL PROCEDURES**

For any medical emergencies or concerns, please follow the guidelines below:

- \* In case of an injury or illness, whether before, during or after the competition, the site director, tournament director, or school nurse should be notified.
- \* Any injured player should not leave campus for any medical care without first consulting the site director and the nurse on duty.
- \* The school nurses are nor permitted to issue students any medication (not even aspirin) unless they are accompanied by their coach or trip administrator.
- \* In case of an injury, or illness off campus resulting in the need of assistance, students should call ISM (if it is during the school day) to talk to one of the tournament officials. If it is after school hours, they should contact either their host families or one of the tournament officials at their homes as listed in the program.

## IASAS SOCCER RULES

#### I. RULES

A. Rule Book:

F.I.F.A. (latest edition):

B. Ground Rules:

The Tournament will be governed by ground rules as instituted by the host school.

C. The official ball is the Brine NCAA (10/02)D. Yellow Card:

A yellow card is the final warning for a player. Any further infringement by the player will be indicated by a "red card". Any player who is shown two yellow cards during the tournament will automatically be suspended for the next game and will be ineligible for all-tournament selection. (5/94)

#### E. Red Card:

- 1. Any player penalized with a "red card" will be evicted for that game and also miss the next game and will be ineligible for all tournament selection. No substitutes will be allowed for penalized players.
- 2. If a goalkeeper is shown a red card, a substitute from the bench may come in for the goalkeeper. A field player must then come off, leaving the team to play with 10 players. (10/00)

NOTE: The site directors must keep a tally of yellow/red cards received and will inform coaches when a player becomes ineligible. (5/99)

Teams must play all rounds of the Round Robin even if the last game is a repeat of the Championship Game. Forfeits are not allowed. (10/00)

#### II. RULE EXCEPTION

A. Playing Time:

35 minute halves, 10 minute half times, (5/98), plus added time for stoppages of play at the referees' discretion, but without adding extra time for substitutions. (10/01)

B. Substitution:

#### III. ROSTERS

Rosters (up to 16 boys and 16 girls) must be submitted two week prior to the tournament and include the following information:

- A. Name:

- C. Passport nationality:
- D. Birth date:
- E. Uniform number (both light and dark); and
- F. Housing preferences

#### IV. ENTRIES

Not Applicable.

#### V. SUBSTITUTION

There will be unlimited substitution subject to the following which replaces the FIFA substitution rule:

- A. 1. The team in possession may substitute on throw-ins and goal kicks only. The team not in possession may substitute only if their players have all ready been "checked in" by officials and only after the team in posses sion makes a substitution. (5/94)
  - 2. Both teams may substitute after a goal has been scored. (5/99)
  - 3. If the referee invites, or asks that, a player be removed from the field due to injury, both teams are allowed to make a substitution at that time. (10/00)
- B. A designated person, other than the Site Director, will coordinate and monitor the substitutions to ensure that all substitutions are made in the approved manner.
- C. Coaches may use their entire bench in every match.
- D. The fourth official monitoring substitutions must use a loud noisemaking device, other than a whistle, to attract the attention of the referee for substitutions. (10/00)

#### VI. FACILITIES

Two soccer pitches are required, one of which must be on the high school campus with some spectator seating. The other pitch should either be on campus or be very near the high school.

#### VII. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT

#### VIII. UNIFORMS

- A. Each player must wear protective shin guards
- B. Each player must have both a white and dark colored jersey with numbers on both the front and back.

#### IX. OFFICIALS

The number and source of officials is to be determined by the host school. Whenever possible, the host school should utilize host country international sporting organizations to officiate tournaments.

### X.TIE BREAKER FOR LEAGUE STANDINGS

- A. Head to Head
  - Definition of Head to Head as specified in section K of the convention organization. If tied, go to B. (10/01)
- B. Goal Difference

Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in all matches exclusively involving the tied teams. The team with the highest score is the winner. If

- exclusively involving the tied teams. The team with the highest score is the winner. If tied, go to C. (10/01)
- C. Take the sum of goals scored and subtract the sum of goals conceded in all matches exclusively involving the tied teams and the highest placed team in the league standings not involved in the tie. (10/01)
- D. Shoot-out

See section XII.

#### XI. TIE BREAKER FOR CHAMPIONSHIP GAME-OVERTIME

- A. Following a five-minute break after regulation play, the respective captains will report to mid-field where the referee will perform the coin toss.
- B. A 7-A-Side (no off-sides called) "sudden death" period will be played. The first team to score is declared the winner. If no team has scored after 7 minutes the teams will exchange field positions. If no team has scored after further 7 minutes, teams will go to the shoot-out procedure (4/02)

#### XII. TIE BREAKER FOR CHAMPIONSHIP GAME-SHOOT-OUT

- A. Each team will be represented by five shooters from 11 designated players, at the end of "sudden death" overtime
- B. All shooters will report to the referee
- C. The referee will record the shooting order
- D. The winner of the shoot-out is based on the most goals scored by either team in five attempts
- If a tie exists at this point, a sudden death shoot-out will take place

#### XIII. PROTEST

- A. First instance, any protest or appeal will be handled by the rule book of the particular activity concerned. This would occur after an appeal to the official.
  - Except where it may be noted specifically in the IASAS guidelines, only official coaches and/or administrators may file a protest at any IASAS event. (5/99)
- B. If "A" is not possible or is subject to further appeal, a formal written appeal should be made to the Head Official of activity. This should be made within two hours and should be made through the site director. The Head Official of the activity i.e. Section Director (e.g. Head Basketball Official, Forensics Tournament Manager, Head Track and Field Official, etc.) must then make a decision.
  - The Section Director should make this decision with or without consultation of the coaches involved in that area. The Section Director is free to consult anyone he/she sees fit in helping to make a decision.
  - A decision should then be communicated to all parties concerned, with copies and a brief report going to the Tournament/Convention Director.
- C. If "B" is appealed, the appeals procedure will continue as follows:

  Further appeal can only occur with the approval of the Section Director. The appeal

shall be in writing and shall be made within two hours of the placing of the decision being appealed. The appeal should be handed to the Section Director who in turn will add his own report and further comments and present the entire matter to the Convention Director.

If the Convention Director cannot or feels he/she cannot solve the situation, he/she should then call a meeting of the Activities Directors/Administrators present at the convention. (NOTE: This meeting is for input and advice only. It is not a voting forum)

At this time, the Convention Director should get all the information he/she needs. This includes a formal meeting if necessary.

The Convention Director will then make the final decision which will be communicated in writing to all school representatives at the convention.

#### XIV. TOURNAMENT SCORING

- A. 3 points for a win (5/95)
- B. 1 point for a draw
- C. O point s for a loss

#### XV. POST SECTION PLAY

- A. After the round-robin league play, the top two seeded teams will play a championship match to decide  $1^{\rm st}$  and  $2^{\rm nd}$  place.
- B. The 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> ranked teams will play for 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
- C. There will be no post section play for the 5th and 6th ranked teams.

  - 3 Team Members-Champion Chevrons (18)
  - 4 Team Members-Gold Medals (18)

Team Members-Bronze Medals (18)

D. All-Tournament:

The 16 all-tournament selected will receive all-tournament chevrons.

## **IASAS RULES & GUIDELINES**

Smoking, drinking alcohol, drug abuse, cheating, deceit, flagrant curfew violations and violations of "off-limits" areas as well as aiding and abetting any of the above will not be permitted during any IASAS event (4/01)

Penalties for infractions are as follows:

- 1. Suspension from further participation in the convention
- 2. A student will be sent home if feasible to do so
- 3. The student will be excluded from all IASAS events for 1 full year including the same event/convention time the following year
- 4. Additionally, students will not be legible for letters or awards for that activity
- 5. Each school will apply additional disciplinary action in compliance with its disciplinary code

Participants must notify coaches or hosts before leaving convention sites. Exploration of the local environment will not be permitted without the knowledge and consent of the host parent/guardian.

Under no circumstances may housing assignments be changed.

All tournament participants (housing or visiting) must return to the host families houses before 10:00pm each night. However, should an event finish later than one hour before the stated curfew, curfew will be extended until one hour after the conclusion of the event. Once a student is in and has answered the curfew call he/she may not leave the house.

All laws of the host country must be observed. Guidelines are to be provided by host schools as required.

No disciplinary action will be taken by the Tournament Director without direct communication with the respective coach/sponsor or trip administrator.

The host school will arrange transport to and from the airport as well as the convention site.

Any problem arising during the convention should be reported immediately to the host school for corrective measures.

Student medical release forms will be available at the convention site each day of the event.

All students must carry with them their Convention Identification Cards.

Stairway Foundation Inc. (SFI) is a non-profit, non-government child care institution licensed and accredited by the Philippine Government. The Foundation was established in 1993 with the assistance from Danish International Development Assistance (DANIDA). The founders of the program, who financed the initial developments and the first years of operation, are still part of the daily operation of the center.

#### Vision

The vision is to see all children realize their abilities, hopes and dreams in a society which will respect and protect their rights as human beings and will hold equality, justice, spirituality, health, education, family, community and the environment as the guiding values and principles for all development.

#### Our Purpose

Stairway works for the promotion and the upholding of children's rights in accordance with the United Nations' Convention on the Rights of the Child. The approach is through a range of programs, which fall under the categories of advocacy, capacity building and service. Stairway Foundations' residential program offers therapy and education for particularly disadvantaged street children and children with serious health problems, such as tuberculosis.

#### Rehabilitation

At Stairway's residential center we work with marginalized street children and youth from Manila. They are beggars, scavengers, prostitutes, solvent users, drug addicts, sexually abused children, youth offenders and children with serious health problems.

As children stay longer on the streets, they immerse deeper into its' subculture. Their problems take another dimension and become even more urgent and complicated. Innovative programs are needed to break the contact between the child and the streets and to facilitate the process of rehabilitation and education, which is necessary to successfully reintegrate the child back into society.

Stairway's recovery and rehabilitation program helps street children to lead safe, healthy and productive lives in a natural, stimulating and creative environment. With a continuous line of activities, emphasizing nature exposure and the arts and crafts, the children develop new values and skills, which consequently heighten their self-esteem and confidence.

#### Residential program

For our residential care program we provided 24 hours services to 32 youth. All underwent art therapy, non-formal or formal schooling, skills trainings, CRC and Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Education, counseling and spiritual formation.

#### Creative Advocacy

Advocacy is not the most tangible vehicle to help the millions of children living on the streets under extremely difficult circumstances. It is, however, only through advocacy that we can mobilize the force of public opinion, which is needed to make a change in the social and economic structures that are largely to blame for the massive violations of children's rights.

Stairway uses the arts as a means to confront, debate and to campaign the issues of marginalized children and youth around the world.
