ABOUT

ISB Vision & Mission

Enriching communities through the intellectual, humanitarian and creative thoughts and actions of our learners. Through outstanding teaching in a nurturing environment, ISB inspires students to achieve their academic and personal potential, be passionate, reflective learners, become caring, global citizens and lead healthy, active, balanced lives

ISB History

Founded in 1951, ISB was the first international school in the Kingdom of Thailand. The school initially opened on the grounds of the US Embassy with 35 students, but with increasing enrollment moved to different campuses in the Bangkok area. Enrollment reached 3,650 students during the Vietnam War. In 1992, ISB moved to its present 35 acre purpose-built campus, 25 km from the center of Bangkok. 1,810 students are currently enrolled in the Elementary, Middle, and High schools.

Interscholastic Association of Southeast Asia Schools

IASAS believes in the development of each student through academic, athletic, and artistic/cultural endeavors. It does this by promoting academic and intellectual pursuits, sports competition, fine and performing arts activities, and cultural and intercultural opportunities. The Cultural Convention events specifically are designed to provide opportunities for students to participate in the Fine and Performing Arts and Debate and Forensics via workshops, productions, concerts or exhibits, and, in the case of Debate and Forensics, through competition. Conducted annually, the goal of each convention is to nurture students' talents, skills, and self-confidence in specific areas of expertise as well as to develop their interests and appreciation for other aspects of the arts and public speaking.

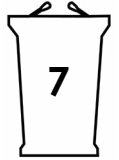
Cultural Convention

Cultural Convention has been an integral part of IASAS since the beginning of the organization during the 1982-83 school year. In fact, the very first convention took place at ISB in April of 1983. Here's how the school yearbook, the Erawan, described that initial event: "The first annual Cultural Fair took place at ISB with the schools competing in the fields of Oratory, Oral Interpretation, Debate, Drama, Music and in the Knowledge Bowl. Each event attracted large crowds from all of the participating schools. ISB did very well, finishing first in Oratory, third in Oral Interpretation, second in Drama and second in the Knowledge Bowl." It is interesting to note that such disciplines as Drama and Music were competitive in nature (this changed by the late 1980's), and that a Knowledge Bowl was part of the early conventions.

Forensics & Debate

The Forensics & Debate tournament is competitive in nature. For Debate, the general rules are modified from the Asian Parliamentary Debate Association. The teams debate topics from a list of 12 topics that have been agreed upon prior to the competition. Teams receive notice of the topics approximately one hour prior to the start of each debate. Judging for Debate is done by trained judges. Cultural Convention Forensics consists of competition in the areas of Oral Interpretation, Original Oratory, Impromptu Speaking and Extemporaneous Speaking. As with CC Debate, judging for all of the CC Forensics events is done by trained judges.

DEFINITIONS



FORENSICS

Forensics is the term used to describe the four speaking events that along with debate form the competitive elements of Cultural Convention. During the convention each speaker is identified by a number and must participate in a minimum of three rounds. In these preliminary rounds each speaker is adjudicated by three judges, and on the basis of ranking achieved in each preliminary round, a group of six speakers per event advances to the finals.

- **Extemporaneous Speaking** is the category where the speaker is given a choice of two questions on current events. The speaker has 30 minutes to prepare a speech to answer one of the questions. The speech must be 5-7 minutes in length.
- **Impromptu Speaking** is the category where the speaker has 1 minute to prepare a 3-5 minute speech on one of the two topics provided.
- **Oral Interpretation** of literature involves a work of either prose or poetry. The speaker chooses and practices the reading and delivers the piece using voice and facial expressions to interpret the mood and meaning of the piece. It must be 5-7 minutes long.
- **Original Oratory** requires a speaker to prepare a 5-7 minute persuasive speech ahead of time on a topic of their choice.

DEBATE

Debate is a regulated, timed discussion of a motion. Each debate has two teams. The proposition team backs the motion. The other team, or opposition, is against the motion. Each team has three debaters who each speak once. These speeches last for 8 minutes each and alternate from proposition to opposition. After each speaker has spoken once both teams are given one 4 minute reply speech. The reply speech is first presented by the opposition team followed by the proposition team. The reply speeches can be given by the first or second speaker on the team. The reply speech is half the length of the main speeches. During the main speeches the opposing team can offer points of information. Points of information can not be offered in the first and the last minute of the speech. Furthermore, no points may be offered during the reply speeches.

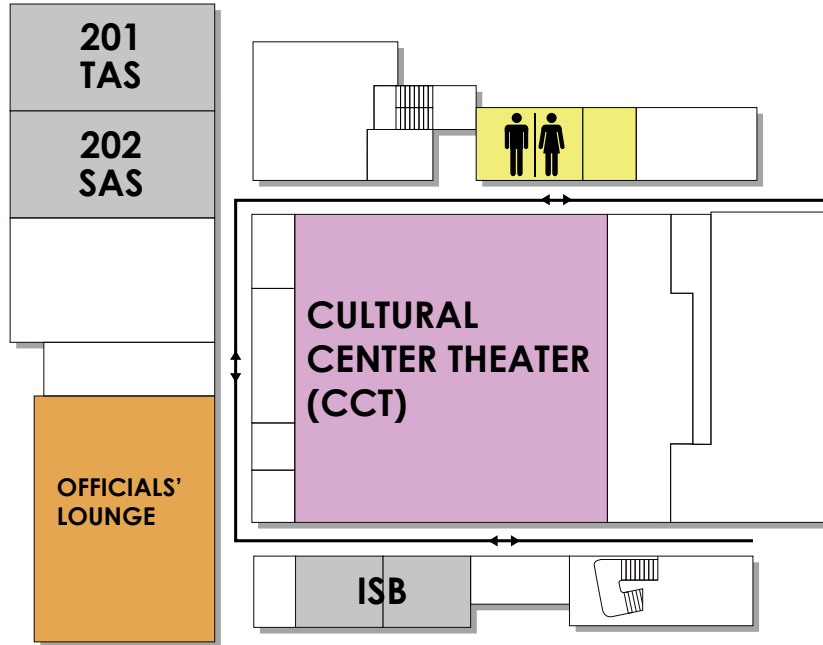

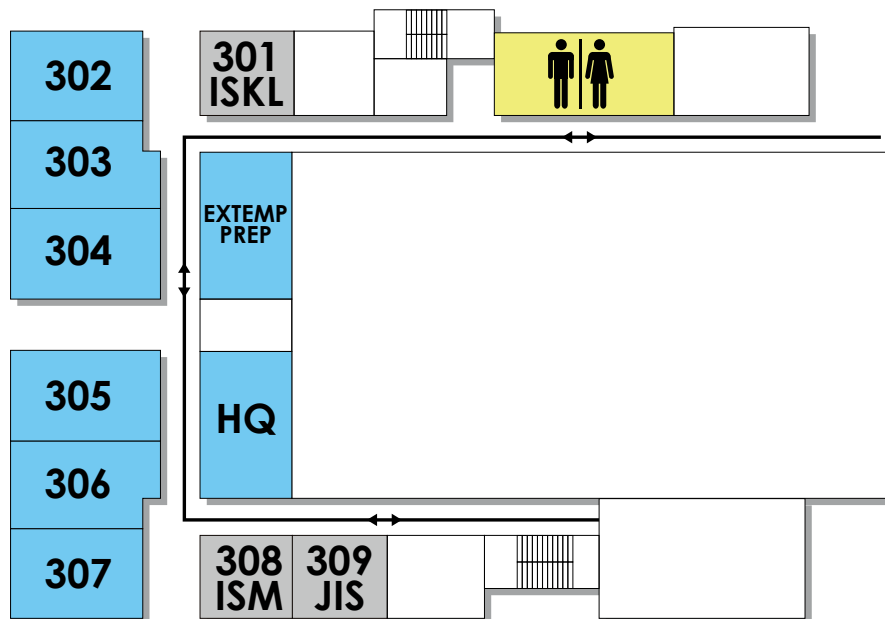
